**A HOPEFUL SIGN**

**CHANNEL MONEY SOUGHT BY FISH COMMISSIONERS**

Virtually assured by the recent \$700,000 addition to the Bonneville dam fishways allocation that the proper lifts and channels on the Washington shore will be installed, fish culturists are now centering their efforts in gaining the pick-up channel through the reservation grounds.

This channel is necessary, they say, to carry the weak fall run of salmon up the river, to provide a non-injurious way for the young fish to return to salt water and to pick up the stragglers which refuse or are too weak to go up the provided lifts.

In view of the fact that the industry is worth \$10,000,000 a year to fishermen, and that the \$150,000 extra required to build this channel is very little compared to the \$41,000,000 to be spent on the completed dam, the game commission is demanding that the highly-important part of the intricate fish passage over the dam be added immediately.

The channel would enter the reservation through Tanner creek, crossing the grounds in a still-water stream and coming out just above the sea locks. Ladders would be necessary at each end, and it is here that the major portion of the additional \$150,000 would be centered.
