GOVERNMENT HOSPITAL COMPLETES VACCINATION

The government hospital last week completed smallpox vaccination of the 650 men employed by the army engineers on the Bonneville dam. But instead of credit for the work, which was completed in four days, loud rose the protests of the men who took their arm shots.

An average of 200 men a day were vaccinated by Dr. Stanley E. Wells and his four assistants, Tom Dippery, Floyd Dodds, Vincent Perlas and Stanley Norris. These were in addition to the usual number of cuts, bruises, treatments and examinations, which on slack days exceeds 50.

Perhaps the only thing that did please the men was the bright, new surgery and dispensary. To gain more room the old surgery room was converted into the ward, and the old ward, vice versa, to the new surgery. A coat of white paint, the addition of a door and the installation of a new infrared heat lamp and "Doc" Wells is as proud as a new father of his hospital.

BACK-FILLING UNDER WAY AT EAGLE CREEK

With the pier and abutments for the Eagle Creek railroad bridge now ready for the letting of the finishing contract, Orino, Bell and Malcolm and its sub-contractor, Kuckenberg and Wittman, began back-filling work last week, the final steps in their railroad relocation contracts at Eagle Creek.

The hardest work in the back-filling must be done by the three-name company. This will require, in addition to the heavy fill against the west abutment, grading work between the Tooth Rock tunnel and the bridge. The first 650 feet of this, from the tunnel to the point, has been completed.

A gash will be cut through the medium material point 30 feet deep and 200 feet long. It will require the services of an excavator, bulldozers and trucks, but will not, it is hoped, necessitate blasting.

On the other side of the creek Kuckenberg and Wittman are clearing away logs and brush, preparatory to pushing the dirt down the hill against the east abutment. Their work will be done within two weeks.
