COUNTY WANTS TO INCORPORATE CASCADE LOCKS

Cascade Locks should become an incorporated town and set up its own police powers, rather than depend upon the services of a justice of the peace, the county court at Hood River told a delegation which appeared before it last Thursday and asked for a minor court in the west end of the county.

The county court told members of the delegation that cost of preparing all papers and other legal work growing out of the move to incorporate would be paid out of county funds.

As a result of the conversations between the delegation and the court it is reported that a meeting will be called at an early date to determine the proper steps to take to bring the movement to incorporate up to a vote of the people.

The problem of boundaries is one that must be determined by the people, the county court told the delegation. There is talk of extending the incorporated limits of the town from the Multnomah county line to Herman creek.

Taxes would not be materially increased, according to information given to the delegation by county officials, who said that the levy for municipal government should not exceed \$1.35 on each \$1,000 valuation. This means, according to estimates prepared at the court house, that a person owning property assessed at \$5,000 would not be taxed more than \$6.75 a year for upkeep of a city government.

Crocodiles of State

The government of Jaipur pays out good money every day to keep crocodiles alive. It has often been said that Jaipur is the most "different" city of India. Certainly it is the only one in that country to be built on a straight-line principle and the only one to have each and every one of its buildings colored mauve or pink. The Crocodile tank is one of the sights of Rajputana, and though it is difficult to ascertain from what far distant religious or mythological rite these beasts obtained their privilege, it is a fact that they are provided with three square meals a day and are tended by a keeper. Whenever this wizardlike old man appears at the water-edge with their foods the big beasts, no matter how soundly they appear to sleep in the mud, immediately swim towards him.

Use of Helium Gas

Air with helium gas content is not poisonous to the body, says Pathfinder Magazine. One of its important uses is to reduce the nitrogen content (about four-fifths of all air) in artificial atmospheres for use in deep sea diving and other work conducted under heavy atmospheric pressure. Experiments conducted by the bureau of mines show that such an atmosphere enables workers to labor for longer periods under higher pressures in safety and comfort than in an ordinary atmosphere.

Cannibalism in Hawaii

So far as has ever been discovered cannibalism has never been practiced by native inhabitants of the Islands of Hawaii, asserts Pathfinder Magazine. On important occasions, however, human sacrifices were offered to the gods, of which there were four principal ones and numerous lesser deities. These sacrificial practices were abandoned in 1807. Prior to the arrival of the first missionaries in the spring of 1820 infanticide was also prevalent among the natives.

TUBERCULOSIS GROUP WILL MEET FRIDAY

The executive board of the Multnomah County Public Health association held its regular monthly meeting in Portland Tuesday.

Mrs. C. W. Merritt, president, and Cecil L. Schreyer, executive director, was appointed by the directors to be official delegates to the 20th annual convention of the Oregon Tuberculosis association, to be held in Pendleton April 12 and 13.

Mrs. Florence Breed, field advisor for the National Tuberculosis association will be one of the principal speakers at the two-day conclave to be devoted to study and reports of tuberculosis control in Oregon. Dr. G. C. Belinger of Salem, Dr. C. I. Drummond of Medford, Dr. J. M. Odell of The Dalles, and Dr. Ralph C. Matson and Mrs. Saldie Orr Dunbar of Portland, are also scheduled to speak.

SURVEY SHOWS HUGE GAIN

A survey completed last week by Hal Babbitt, of the Bonny Villa tavern, of the district between the guard gate at Bonneville and Bonny Park, revealed that the district has grown from less than 25 homes to 386 in one year. Averaging three to a family, estimates show that there are slightly more than 1000 people in the district.

FIRST CONCRETE IS POURED IN FISHWAY

Work on the fishways from the sea locks across Bradford island required the services of many men last week, as the first concrete pouring got under way. First to be poured was the pier wall at the north end of the powerhouse. Forms were then placed for the first slab and it was poured.

The way across the powerhouse, which runs directly on top of the draft tube openings at the down-river side, is little better than half completed. Steelworkers and concrete men are needed in other parts of the huge power-generating plant and this way received little attention.

Jackhammer men started drilling holes in the sides of the 80-foot way between the locks and powerhouse Thursday for the reinforcing steel, although actual pouring in this location will not, it is believed, be started before fall.
