Each team made 10 hits, George Beals of Parkdale starring by knocking out a homer with one man on in the fifth inning. Dave Johnson of Cascade Locks made four hits, one for each time up. Batteries were Jim Johnson and Buster Helvogt for the Locks; Rush, Walters and Butterfield for Parkdale.

COFFERDAM KEEPS HEAD ABOVE WATER

With the river in an uncertain mood, bets are being laid on the day and hour when the high water will go over the cofferdam.

Best bet, according to the weather bureau and information trickling down from the upper Columbia, places the date of submersion after May 1.

The river has been standing about level for the past few days, following a small drop after the rise last week. The top of the cofferdam is still five or six feet above the surface of the water, but there is no life about it. Columbia pulled out all of its equipment and stopped the pumps last week. This allowed the interior of the cofferdam to fill and will have the effect of bracing against the high water of next month.

BLAZE CAUSES ALARM AT COMMUNITY CENTER
