LEGION WILL REWARD OUTSTANDING STUDENTS

Although the end of the present school year is drawing near, Bonneville Post No. 88, American Legion, has secured the approval of the principal and teachers of the local Bonneville school to permit them to award to the outstanding boy and girl of the eighth grade, or graduating class, who best represents those qualities of character and ability which they believe will result in worthy citizenship and well rounded manhood and womanhood.

The award shall be made to the boy of the graduating class who shall receive the highest total percentage on the following basis of weights:

Honor: Strength and stability of character; high standards of conduct; keen sense of what is right; adherence to truth and conscience and devotion to duty and practice of clean speech, 20 per cent.

Courage: Bravery in the face of opposition and danger, and grit to stand up for the right and do one's duty, 20 per cent.

Scholarship: Scholastic attainment; evidence of industry and application in studies, 20 per cent.

Leadership: Ability to lead and to accomplish through group action, 20 per cent.

Service: Kindliness; unselfishness, fellowship; protection of the weak and promotion of the interests and welfare of associates without hope of personal reward, 20 per cent.

The girl's medal is awarded on the basis of the following qualifications: Courage, companionship, character, service and scholarship.

The medals are of bronze, designed by the eminent sculptor R. Tait MacKenzie, and are a beautiful and noble conception. On one side appears the American Eagle and the emblem of the American Legion, with the engrossed words "American Legion School Award for Courage, Honor, Service, Leadership and Scholarship." On the reverse side are symbolic figures representing the land and sea forces, back to back, protecting the maritime commerce and the home life of the nation with a border inscription reading "For God and Country," and the inspiring motto of the Marines "Semper Paratus" (Faithful always).

The action of the American Legion in making this award is to place emphasis on the development of character and scholarship in school pupils, the Legion feeling that one of the highest purposes to which it can devote its energies is the cultivation of high character and wholesome ideals in the youth coming to citizenship.

In addition to the medals to be awarded the outstanding boy and girl of the graduating class, there will also be two certificates of merit awarded to one boy and one girl of the seventh grade, on the same basis as outlined above. It is felt by awarding these certificates to the seventh grade pupils, who will enter the eighth grade and graduating class next school year, there will be more of an incentive for the members of that class to work for the medal awards next year, it being the object of the Bonneville post to continue this practice each year, at least as long as the post is in existence here.
