**SALMON RUN BRINGS
FISHERMEN UP RIVER**

Columbia river commercial salmon fishermen began arriving in the dam area last week for the opening of the fishing season May 1.

Fritz Johnson piloted his new fishboat 157 miles upstream from Altoona, near Astoria, and plans to return for two more vessels. Johnson is the fisherman who rescued six men from the jetty at Altoona this spring when the freighter "Clarion" was wrecked in a storm.

Salmon are running into the river strong at Astoria, according to Johnson, who from their numbers believes this season may be as plentiful as 1920. However, the run hasn't reached the dam yet and is not expected to arrive in force for a week yet.

A number of other fishermen, including Bob Butler, Earl Pulliam and Neil Johnson, are reported to be on their way to fishing grounds at Hood River straits.

**MAIN CABLEWAY JOB
LET TO WASHINGTON**

Washington Iron works was awarded the contract for installation of the main spillway dam cableway, highest ever constructed, to be completed August 1.

The cableway will be of double radial type, with a stationary tower 225 feet high at North Bonneville. Two 90-foot travelling head towers each with 20-ton capacity, will operate on Bradford island on a radial track 100 feet long in front of the dam. Cables 2025 feet in length will span the river to bring all concrete, a well as forms reinforcing steel and some excavated material, for construction of the main dam.

The work is being done by Columbia Construction company and is similar to the cableway built by Washington Iron works, now operating over the power house project.
