## At the Theatre

Tonight and tomorrow night Robert Montgomery, in the role of the gentleman in "The Mystery of Mr. X," will pit his wits against those of Scotland Yard's wily sleuths as they try to unravel the mystery of nine deaths, each on a successive night.
