DAM GOES CRAZY ON CHAIN LETTERS

The Bonneville dam area has gone chain letter-crazy to the tune of a 100 per cent increase in postal receipts at Bonneville and a 233 per cent increase at Cascade Locks.

Despite the large number of men laid off at the dam because high water prohibits working, approximately double the usual amount of mail has been handled at Bonneville. Postmaster Edlund reports cancelling out about 5000 letters a day. At Cascade Locks Postmaster Frank Hall saw his stamp sales nearly quadruple several days last week.

One excited citizen in the area dropped a dollar bill in each of the five letters he sent to carry on a chain, mailed them before realizing his mistake. After the first outburst, he cooled down, to walk away assuring himself that the fabulous profits from the enterprise would make the lost five sink into insignificance. One woman is said actually to have induced a painter to begin painting her house on credit on the strength of her expected returns for the letters she had sent.

DIGNITARIES HELP OPEN NEW LOCKS I.O.O.F. HALL

Cascade Locks' new I. O. O. F. hall was officially dedicated Monday night when Odd Fellows and Rebekahs in joint session met in the club rooms for the first time.

Mrs. Grace Christianson, president of the Rebekah assembly of Oregon, paid Cascadia Rebekah lodge an official visit accompanied by Grand Master Charles Poole of the grand I. O. O. F. lodge of Oregon.

Representatives of The Dalles lodges included Doris Sexton, grand secretary of the assembly of Oregon and Frank Sexton, deputy grand master of Oregon. From Hood River on an unofficial visit came Earl Shanks, grand representative of the sovereign grand lodge.

Mrs. Silver Perras, Cascadia Rebekah lodge's noble grand, presided. Lunch was served the 40 persons present by Rebekah members.

ALCORN GET \$5,750 FOR BONNEVILLE LAND

A federal court jury last week awarded Mildred and Waldo Alcorn \$5750 for seven acres of land seized by the government for use as part of the Bonneville dam project.

The government had offered \$2000 for the land. The Alcorns asked \$30,000. Witnesses for the Alcorns before Federal Judge McNary placed a value of \$55,000 on the property. The jury compromised on \$5750.

The Alcorn property adjoins that of Mrs. E. Bell Hill, who last month was awarded \$72,500 for her 26 acres, now used for construction locations.

DRUNKEN DRIVER GETS \$125 FINE, JAIL TERM

Jack V. Guynn, Bonneville, was fined \$125 and \$5 costs, given a 60-day suspended sentence, had his driver's license revoked for one year when he pled guilty Friday before County Judge Stranahan at Hood River to charges of drunken driving.

Guynn was arrested early Thursday morning while driving through Cascade Locks by Deputy Sheriff C. H. Brown and State Officer C. P. Boss, who took him to Hood River to await trial. Sentence was suspended on payment of the fine, Guynn being paroled for two years in custody of his brother.

"This drunken driving is going to stop," Deputy Sheriff Brown

declared. "Hood River county is being aided by the state to stamp it out, and from now on it's going to be plenty tough on those who are caught."
