500 TURN OUT AT AUDITORIUM HOUSEWARMING

Brightest, gayest, biggest event of Bonneville's social history was the dedicatory housewarming of the dam reservation auditorium Friday night.

LOCKS ASSESSED VALUE WILL BE ABOUT \$350,000

Valuation of real and personal taxes in Cascade Locks for taxation purposes are going to be about \$250,000. It was announced this week by County Assessor George M. Knox.

Information from the assessor has been awaited by residents of the town, who wished to know what the valuations are going to be before attempting to fix a probable tax rate to cover cost of operating a municipal government.

Current tax rate for this year was reported by the assessor at \$27.48 on each \$1,000 valuation. This is another way of saying the tax rate was 27 1/2 mills in Cascade Locks, divided as follows:

General (county and state) 18.42.

School district No. 1, 9.06.
Total, 27.48.

Sponsors of incorporation insist that a 10-mill tax will raise \$3,500 in revenues. This statement is confirmed by Assessor Knox, who says a levy of 14.30 mills will raise \$5,000.

Business men desirous of seeing the town incorporated point out that it will be necessary to raise only \$3,500 by direct taxation, for the balance, they say, will come from a portion of the beer tax which the state returns to incorporated towns, from licenses, fines, fees, etc.

Both proponents and opponents of incorporation agree that it is going to cost \$5,000 a year to maintain a municipal government. According to figures prepared by Assessor Knox it would require a tax of \$1.43 on each hundred dollar valuation if the entire \$5,000 is raised by direct levy, or \$1 on each hundred valuation if \$3,500 is raised by direct levy and the remaining \$1500 is raised through indirect taxes.

The information released by Assessor Knox was conveyed to Carl Epping in a letter.

Here are some extracts:
"I do not have Mr. Labor's valuation for this year yet."

"The O. W. R. & N. company and the utilities operating over it pay about 70 per cent of the taxes in Cascade Locks."

"It is not going to work a hardship on any but a very few."

In light of the information made public by Assessor Knox, every property owner can determine the increase in his or her taxes. If the budget is fixed at \$5,000 a year and \$3,500 is obtained through a direct tax levy it means that a person owning property assessed at \$1,000 for taxation purposes would pay \$10 a year in municipal taxes, or less than \$1 a month.
