OBS POURS CONCRETE ON TUNNEL EXTENSION

First concrete for the west portal extension on Union Pacific's Tooth rock tunnel was poured Saturday by Orino, Bell and Malcom, railroad relocation contractors.

The extension increases the tunnel length from 600 to 700 feet, was ordered by U. S. engineers to protect the tracks from rock slides. When the concreting is finished, a backfill of rock will be placed on the uphill side of the barrel so future slides may rumble across its top to drop into Bradford slough without damaging concrete.

OBS expects the job to be completed the middle of September. It involves pouring approximately 100 yards of concrete.

CIGARET THROWER FINED

It cost L. R. Deisch of Fairview \$5 to throw a lighted cigarette from his car into the Columbia river highway near Eagle creek. He appeared before Justice Eastman at Gresham Monday evening. At the Theatre

Following tonight's showing of Edmund Lowe in "Mr. Dynamite," wisecracking murder mystery, at the Roosevelt theatre on the Bonneville dam reservation, patrons will see on the next week's bill from a millionaire old maid turning detective through tender romance and lilting music to a "Sez you!—Sez me!" story of smugglers and deep-sea divers.

Old-maid detective is the noted English star, Constance Collier, who plays "Aunt Melissa" in "Shadow of Doubt," coming Friday and Saturday. The picture is filmed from Arthur Somers Roche's Colliers magazine serial, includes Richardo Cortez, Isabel Jewell, Regis Toomey.

"Aunt Melissa" has millions, hasn't left her house in 20 years. To aid loved ones, she emerges from seclusion to track to earth a dangerous criminal.

The glamorous love story or an operatic star is told in "One Night of Love," starring beautiful Grace Moore, Sunday, Monday and Tuesday at the Roosevelt.

Miss Moore appears in a role similar to her own life, that of a young singer aspiring to sing before the Metropolitan opera company. She studies in Italy under a master, played by Tullio Carminali, with whom she is under contract not to fall in love. Of course, she does, to the despair of the happy-go-lucky American, Lyle Talbot, who has proposed marriage. Miss Moore goes on to higher singing heights, eventually sings at the Metropolitan, wins her singing master. Critics have acclaimed the picture something entirely new, claim that it writes screen history with its lilting melodies, its thrilling, pulsing romance.

"The Best Man Wins," Wednesday and Thursday on the Roosevelt screen shows Edmund Lowe and Jack Holt at the rowdiest, teamed for the first time in their screen careers.

They are pals, undersea divers. Lowe is injured in an attempt to rescue his pal, Holt, pinioned against a sunken hull. As a result his arm is amputated. Both leave the profession, Holt to become a harbor patrolman, Lowe to an aide of the diamond smuggler, Beli Lugosi. What happens when Holt finds it out is made even more dramatic by the fact that both are in love with the same girl, Florence Rice. The underwater scenes have been termed by critics to be excellent.

DAM PAVEMENT FINISH SCHEDULED THIS WEEK

Finish of paving Bonneville dam reservation permanent streets is expected the end of this week. The job, which motorists have long awaited, was begun early in July by Warren Northwest Roads, Inc. At first thought to be completed in two weeks, work has been delayed by inclement weather.

The pavement, 1800 tons of blacktop, runs from the Columbia river highway under Tanner creek viaduct, loops around the new auditorium, runs among the permanent houses and over towards the sea locks. Paving ends abruptly just before the turn in front of Bonneville postoffice. When additions are made in the future to increase the number of permanent quarters, paving will be continued, but for the present the reservation business district will remain on a gravelled street.
