DAM PHOTOS FOUND IN SLAIN MAN'S CAMERA

State police are searching along the Columbia river highway between Portland and Arlington for the hitch-hiker who is believed to have murdered Roy Hamm of Portland, July 26, near Meacham.

Hamm's camera contained negatives of Bonneville dam construction, showing he stopped here for some time. State police are asking that any person who saw Hamm get in touch with them.

Hamm was driving a gray 1924 Nash coupe, reconstructed, Montana license 7-T-750. Attached was a two-wheel trailer loaded with furniture under canvas. The hitch-hiker was believed to be between 40 and 45 years of age, 5 feet 10 or 11 inches tall, 170 pounds, medium dark complexion.
