Thirty men of the state highway department expect to finish the job of patching rough spots in the Columbia river highway from Multnomah fall towards Bonneville today or tomorrow.

They have been laying down new blacktop nonskid paving to make the famous road smoother. Their allotment of 500 tons of tar and gravel was estimated to be used up late this week, with patching reaching east just past Warrendale. The crew expects to be moved then to Hood River, to work west from there towards the dam until the work is finished.

**Forest Service**

Logging operations in this district were shut down Monday morning to reduce the extreme fire hazard caused by high temperatures, strong east winds and low humidity. The order, announced by District Ranger Roy L. Weeman, will continue until further notice, probably until next week, effects mills at Bridal Veil Lumber company, Smitke Pulp company, Ridge Timber company.

A sawdust pile at Palmer hill broke into flames Monday morning. Twenty CCC men, the tanker from Columbia Gorge station and forest guards finally corralled it, put it out late in the afternoon.

Ranger Weeman's eagle eye came in handy Monday afternoon. Passing the 50 milepost, in the patrol car, he spotted a gunny sack on the road shoulder with a thin streak of smoke coming from it. Someone, he says, had thrown a cigaret from a car and if he hadn't spotted it when he did, a serious fire might have resulted.
