## ROOSEVELT HOTEL TO OPEN ANNEX SEPT. 1

Roosevelt hotel's 12-room annex, back of the present building, will be opened September 1, D. R. Scoffern, hotel manager, announced yesterday.

Finishing touches to the annex, planned primarily for bachelor quarters, are being applied this week. Furnishings have all arrived on the scene and are being put in place.

The 12 rooms are situated side by side, opening onto the porch running the full 125 feet of the building. The annex is high enough so that its residents may look down on Tanner creek and the dam reservation.

## RIVER SOUNDING UNDER WAY FOR NORTH CRIBS

Eighteen men under Dick Holbrook, in charge of waterfront activities for the U. S. engineers, are sounding the Columbia river bottom between the cofferdam and the Washington shore, in preparation for placement of the north cofferdam late this winter.

From the sounding barge leads are dropped to the bottom and depth noted carefully over the entire area north of the present cribs. When the work is finished, U. S. engineers will have a minute study of contours of the river bottom to aid them in planning the tailoring of the north side cribs. The cribs must conform to the river bottom so closely that water inflow is at a minimum.
