COUNCIL SEEKS QUARTERS FOR CITY BUILDING

The hunt for a satisfactory building which can be used by the municipal government of Cascade Locks as a city hall is still on, with members of the city council growing a little discouraged.

Since the council took over its duties it has been meeting in the rear of the state station, where the city is enjoying free rent through generosity of Seth O. Clodfelter. The room, small at the best, resembled a sardine box Monday night when it was packed by visitors, who wanted to observe the city fathers at work.

A committee, named to seek quarters for the city government, reported that the owners of the Odd Fellows hall wanted \$25 a month rent and said that the Odd Fellows had not yet fixed upon a rental for the hall.

G. N. Heggard, who ran for the city council on the taxpayers league ticket and was defeated, has offered to sell the city a lot and a shell of a building just south of Julius Carlson's property for \$1,000. The council took no action upon the offer.

FOREST RULES IN FORCE

Regulations governing camp fires and smoking while walking in the national forests have been continued in force, due to the extreme dry weather for this season of the year. C. J. Buck, regional forester, has announced that all persons will be expected to carry an axe, shovel and water trail while camping in the forest. The season expired September 30, but through proclamation the regulations remain in force until further notice.
