**RIVER HITS LOW PEAK
AND IS RISING AGAIN**

Rain last Friday night halted the drop of the Columbia and caused it to level off and rise some after touching a low of 79,000 second cubic feet.

Last October the river fell to 70,000 second cubic feet, which was unusually low, and indications were that the record might be equalled again this fall, but it is highly improbable.

An inch of rain fell Friday night and Saturday in the district. This had no material bearing on the flow of the river, but the rain was general far over into Idaho and up in British Columbia. The run-off from the entire watershed caused the flow to increase and has led engineers to believe that the season's low has been passed.
