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INFORMATION FOR VOTERS ON CASCADE LOCKS WATER BONDS ISSUE

This information is furnished by the Cascade Locks Chamber of Commerce in response to the following questions.

Q. Why do we need a new water system?
A. Because the present supply is impure and inadequate.

Q. What will the new water system cost?
A. The original application to PWA was for \$56,000, of which \$31,000 is to be covered by a Bond Issue and \$25,000 to be GIVEN to the City by PWA. Engineers estimate about \$45,000.

Q. Why does PWA **GIVE** the City \$25,000?
A. To furnish more employment to men.

Q. How much will be spent for employment?
A. About \$37,000.

Q. How much for materials?
A. About \$19,000.

Q. Who will buy the Bonds.
A. The U. S. government agrees to buy the bonds bearing 4 per cent interest, payable over a period of **30 YEARS**, and make us an outright present of \$25,000. A first payment on principle has to be made by November, 1937.

Q. Who will have control of the construction of the system and handle the money?
A. The Mayor and City Council under the supervision of the Engineers of PWA.

Q. Who approves plans for system and who lets contracts?
A. Plans and specifications are prepared by Mr. Hurlburt, City Engineer, subject to approval of the PWA Engineers.

Q. Who determines engineering and legal costs.
A. The U. S. government in cooperation with the Mayor, City Council and City Engineer of Cascade Locks.

Q. Who pays for easements on properties used by proposed systems?
A. The City, if there be any, out of the PWA funds.

Q. What will J. B. Laber receive for easements thru his property?
A. Mr. Laber has made a public statement to the City Council that he will **GIVE** all necessary easements free of charge.

Q. What arrangements can City make with PWA as to terms of liquidation of bonds?
A. Terms as to repayment are to be mutually agreed upon by the City Council and PWA. It is understood that nothing but the interest is payable in 1936 and first principal payment November 1, 1937.

Q. Will all parts of the City be provided with water, irrespective of them being platted or unplatted.
A. All will be treated alike. The City will endeavor to get all the water revenues they can from users or owners.

Q. What insurance rate reductions may be expected if water system that is planned and approved by underwriters be installed?
A. Substantial reduction is expected, but cannot be determined until fire protection system is installed.

Q. How will wages on proposed water system installation compare with prevailing wage scales?
A. Prevailing local union wages will be paid.

Q. Who can vote on bond issue?
A. Any registered voter living in City of Cascade Locks. Voters do not have to be property owners.

Q. When must work start?
A. Must start by December 12th.

Q. Who will be employed on construction?
A. Cascade Locks residents, if registered for employment.

Q. Will there be a plentiful supply of water at all periods of the year?
A. Yes. Engineer has provided for covered reservoir holding between 225,000 and 300,000 gallons.

Q. Why such a large reservoir?
A. Because the Oregon Rating Bureau requires a water storage of at least 5-hour-flow in the event of a fire.
