UMATILLA REPLACED

BY NEW STEAMBOAT

The steamboat Undine entered the upriver run this week under the name of The Dalles. It replaces the old Umatilla, which has been shutting back and forth on the river for months.

Rebuilt in Portland, the steamer was put into service by the Shaver Forwarding company. It will carry cargoes and passengers between The Dalles and Portland. The boat has a capacity of 200 tons, is 170 feet long, 25 feet wide and draws seven feet of water.

According to an announcement by the Shaver Forwarding company the steamer will make two round trips a week and make special runs when business justifies it.
