Mrs. Morgan's father, H. H. Weston, at Boardman.

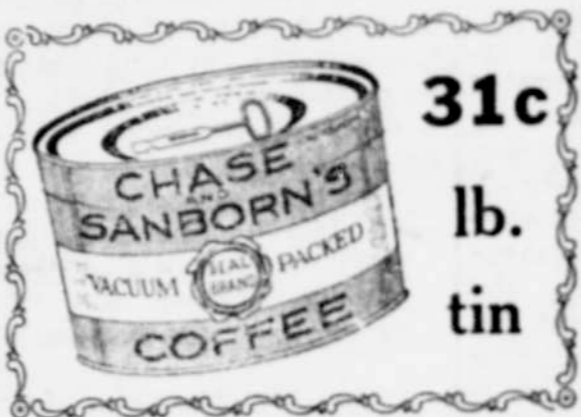
