## At the Theatre

This week's presentations at the Roosevelt theater in Bonneville are three of the most exciting and glamorous tales told in the films this past year.

Friday and Saturday, Paul Robeson, Leslie Banks, and Nina Mae McKinney appear in "Sanders of the River, a tale of the Congo."

Robeson, who is a great singer as well as a great actor, was last seen on the screen in the title role of "Emperor Jones," and Nina Mae McKinney scored in King Vidor's memorable all-negro production, "Hallelujah."

In "Sanders of the River," Robeson plays Bosambo, the big, lovable native who helps the miracle-working British District Commissioner Sanders maintain peace among the warring tribes of the Congo. Nina Mae is seen as Lilongo, the beautiful slave girl whom Bosambo makes his bride, while Banks, who scored in "The Most Dangerous Game" and "The Man Who Knew Too Much" is cast as the courageous and resourceful Sanders.

The picture was almost entirely filmed in the African Congo where director Zoltan Korda led a location unit, and shot many scenes depicting tribal rites dances and chants never before recorded. Several tribal chiefs and some 20,000 natives took part in the film.

Sunday, Monday and Tuesday brings "Clive of India" with Ronald Colman and Loretta Young.

The story covers the life of Robert Clive, who by his own audacity rose from a \$25 a year clerk in the East India Company to become conqueror of an Empire at 26, and became England's greatest hero.

Stressing the beautiful romance between Clive and the lovely Margaret Maskylene, to whom he proposed by letter after seeing her picture in her brother's locket, the drama shows how the man's private life influenced his public life, and how his star fell when the woman who had loved him had drifted from his side.

The production, which Richard Boleslawski directed for release through United Artists, contains faithful reproductions of such historic scenes as the Battle of Plassey, Clive's trial in the House of Commons and the horror of the Black Hole of Calcutta.

Loretta Young plays the lovely Margaret, while Colin Clive, Francis Lister, C. Aubrey Smith and Cesar Romero are also prominent among the film's seventy-two principals.

Wednesday and Thursday will be shown "Diamond Jim", a tale of the fabulously rich in the early mining days of Colorado.
