GRAZING FEES SHOW CATTLE IMPROVEMENT

Reflecting substantially improved conditions in the range livestock industry in 1935 grazing fees on national forest ranges of Oregon and Washington will be increased this year, according to recent announcement by the U. S. forest service. Increases are in accord with the forest officials in 1933, by which adjustments in grazing fees were to be made, in proportion to price changes from the rates of 1931 adopted as the base.

Gradual return to pre-depression levels in livestock prices is shown by beef cattle and lamb price averages for the past three years upon which grazing fees are based, according to the forest service. Based upon average sheep prices for the period of 1929 to 1932 inclusive as 100, 1932 prices rated 65 per cent; 1933, 53 per cent; 1934, 60 per cent; and 1935, 75 per cent. Similarly using cattle prices from 1921 to 1936 inclusive as the base, 1932 prices rated 62 1/2; 1933 rated 52; 1934, 55; and 1935, 60 per cent.

Following this accepted formula, national forest grazing fees this year are set at 50 per cent of the 1931 base rate for cattle and 75 per cent of the 1931 base rate for sheep. This means that the 1936 grazing fee for cattle will be 10% less and the sheep fee 25 per cent less than the 1931 base fee, but that the 1936 cattle fee will be 62 per cent higher than the respective fees in 1935, the forest service states.

The forest service points out that averages received by producers in the eleven western states during 1935, calculated by the U. S. bureau of agricultural economics. The average national forest grazing fee in 1935 for cattle is 15.05 cents and for sheep 3.36 cents per head per month.
