**At the Theatre**

"Mutiny on the Bounty" starring Clark Gable, Charles Laughton and Franchot Tone will arrive at the Roosevelt theater Sunday for a three-day stay.

Sunday, Monday and Tuesday this famous film will be shown at the Roosevelt theater in Bonneville. From the writer's viewpoint this is the most outstanding picture that has ever been shown at the local house. If you have not seen it you should see it and many that have seen it will probably attend again.

The picture is the true story of the voyage of H.M.S. Bounty, 150 years ago, on a scientific expedition to the South Seas. It tells of the tyranny of a brutal captain who drove his crew to mutiny, of the life and loves of the sailors in a tropical paradise and the dogged pursuit of Captain Bligh for the men who had fed him to the wrath of the sea by casting him adrift in an open boat.

"Mutiny on the Bounty" lives up to all the advance praise has has shouted the picture's merits around the world. Its scenic beauty, sometimes stark and cruel, is unsurpassed. Its cast, headed by Charles Laughton, Clark Gable and Franchot Tone, is incomparable.

If anyone enjoys a good laugh they should see the film "Going Highbrow" with Guy Kibbee, Zasu Pitts, Edward Everett Horton which shows Friday and Saturday of this week end.

The picture is based on the hilarious play by Ralph Spence and concerns the wife of a Kansas farmer, suddenly become rich, who hires

herself a publicity man, and adopts a waitress as a daughter, to launch herself into New York's socially elite.

Guy Kibbee, as the farmer has never put over a finer characterization in his life, in this reviewer's opinion.

Zasu Pitts, the ambitious wife, is always a scream, but in this picture she is given an unusual opportunity to display her artistry.

Edward Everett Horton is excellent in his role of the blundering publicity manager, who stages the plan to go highbrow in order to finance an aristocratic, but impoverished family.

The romantic leads are handled by Ross Alexander and June Martel, both of the Broadway stage, who recently went to Hollywood and are now "Going Highbrow," in a manner of speaking. Both do the fine

work that one would expect of experienced stage players.

On the Wednesday and Thursday following "Mutiny on the Bounty", George Brent and Belle Davis appear in an exciting yarn of the newspaper world, "Front Page Woman". The two leading personages are reporters on rival papers. The man is in love with the girl but will not allow this relationship to interfere with his vocation. The battle is on as the love interest increases. He frames her on a story and makes her appear ridiculous.

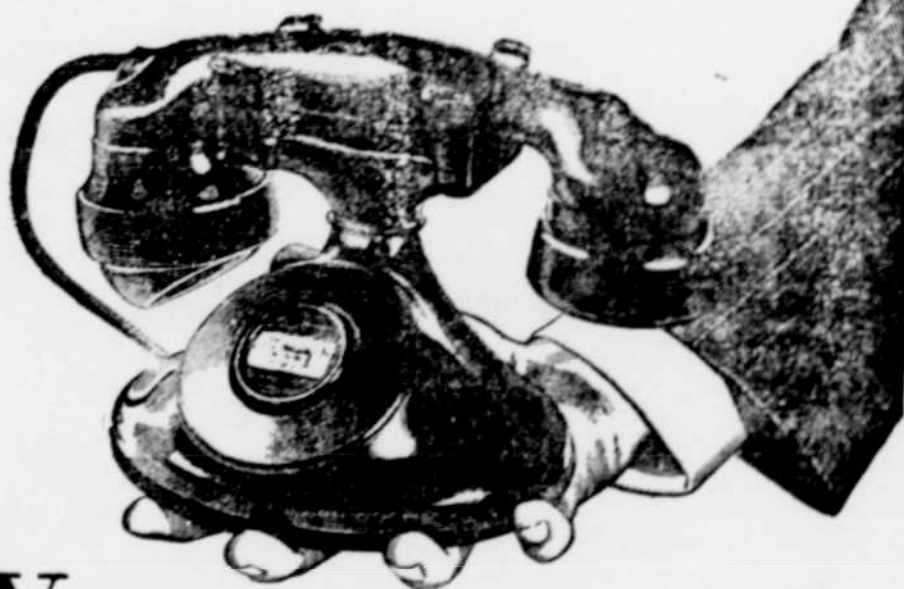

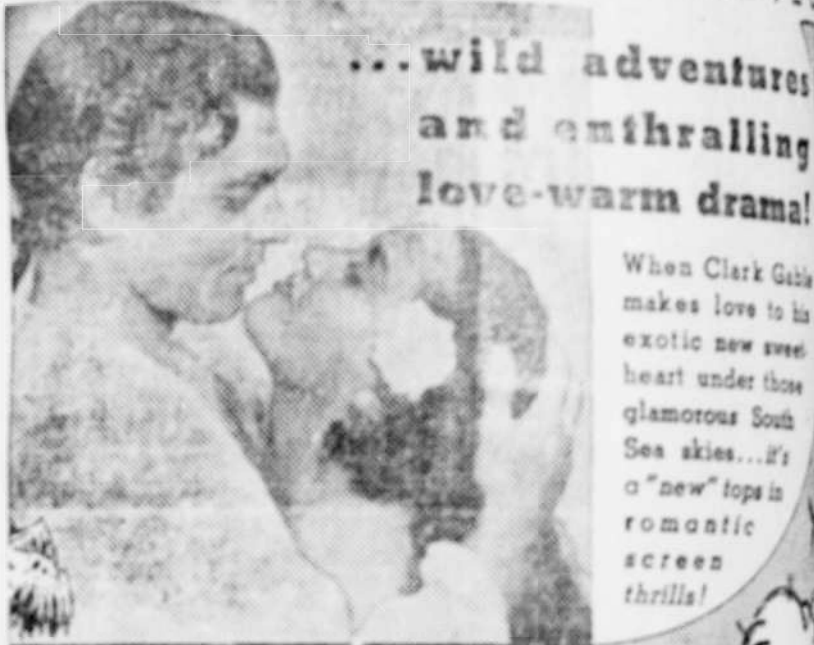
