Two shifts are being employed at the Herman creek hydroelectric plant to keep ice from plugging the head gates and shutting off the generators. Line crews are patrolling the wires to prevent breakage caused either by formation of ice or by slides.

BAFFLE PIERS PERMIT UNIMPEDED FISH RUN

Despite the possible blocking of the channel by the new cribs and the south unit of the main dam, migrating fish need not turn back from the upper-river spawning grounds when they make their annual pilgrimage during 1936.

Fishways and ladders will not be completed nor in operation by the time the run is expected out a series of baffle-piers, or square piers of concrete have been placed between piers 10 and 11 that will break up the water in the form of steps to such an extent that it is expected the fish will be able to stem the heavy current and so reach the quiet water above the dam.

These are to be placed between all existing piers of the main dam and will in addition to their usage as an auxiliary fishway, will serve as additional keys at such time as the remainder of the dam proper is poured probably next year some time.

PROPOSED INITIATIVE BANS RIVER FISHTRAP

Petitions are being circulated for an initiative measure forbidding the use of all fixed fishing gear on the Columbia river and its tributaries in Oregon.

The proposed state law will forbid the use of "any drag seine, whip seine, point net, fish wheel, fish trap, fish wheel scow, setnet, weir or any fixed appliance for catching salmon, salmon trout or steelhead." The measure exempts Indians fishing under federal regulations and permits the federal government or the state to take fish in any manner for scientific or propagational purposes.
