The Meyers' dog, Spot, has been wearing his nose in a sling following an argument with Daffy, a cat belonging to Etta Sothern.

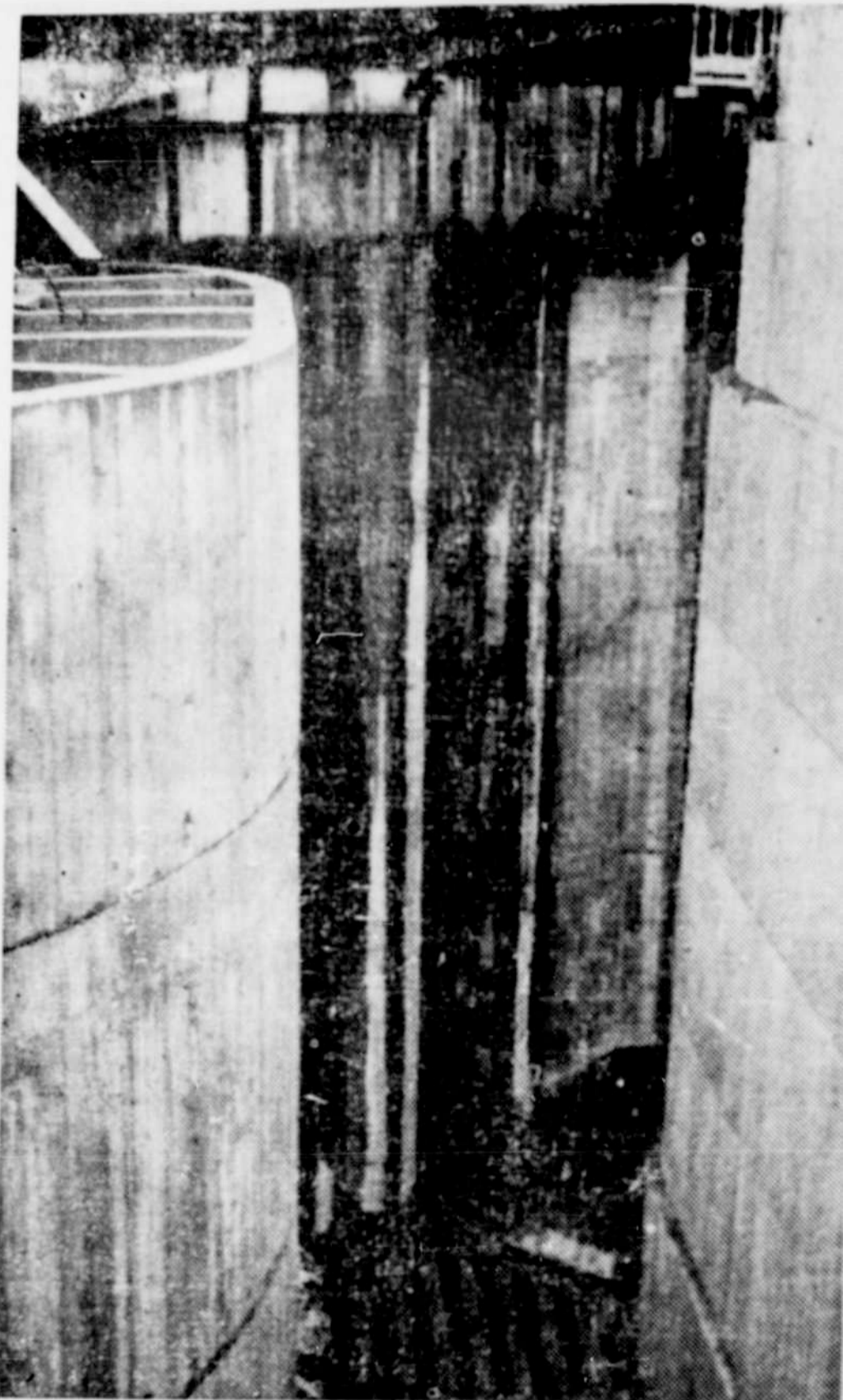
Mr. and Mrs. O. M. Eklund and daughter, Margie, will go to Culver, Or., over Decoration day to visit Mrs. Eklund's father.
