Notice is hereby given that at the school district bond election hereby called to be held at Cascade Locks High School Building in and for School Sub-School District No. 1, of Hood River County, Oregon, the 2nd day of July, A. D. 1935, between the hours of two o'clock p.m. and seven o'clock p.m., there will be submitted to the legal voters thereof the question of contracting a bonded indebtedness in the sum of \$37,900.00 for the purpose of extension and repairs to Cascade Locks High School, \$8,000.00; for an addition to Barrett Grade School, \$8,500.00; for a new Auditorium, Gymnasium, Science Building for Odell High School, \$11,500.00; for an extension to Parkdale High School, \$9,900.00, in and for said school district.

The vote to be by ballot upon which shall be the words "Bonds—Yes" and "Bonds—No"; and the voter shall place a cross (X) between the word "Bonds" and the word "Yes" or between the word "Bonds" and the word "No" which indicates his choice.

The polls for the reception of the ballots cast for or against the contraction of said indebtedness will, on said day and date and at the place aforesaid, be opened at the hour of two o'clock p.m. and remain open until the hour of seven o'clock p.m. of the same day when the same shall be closed.
