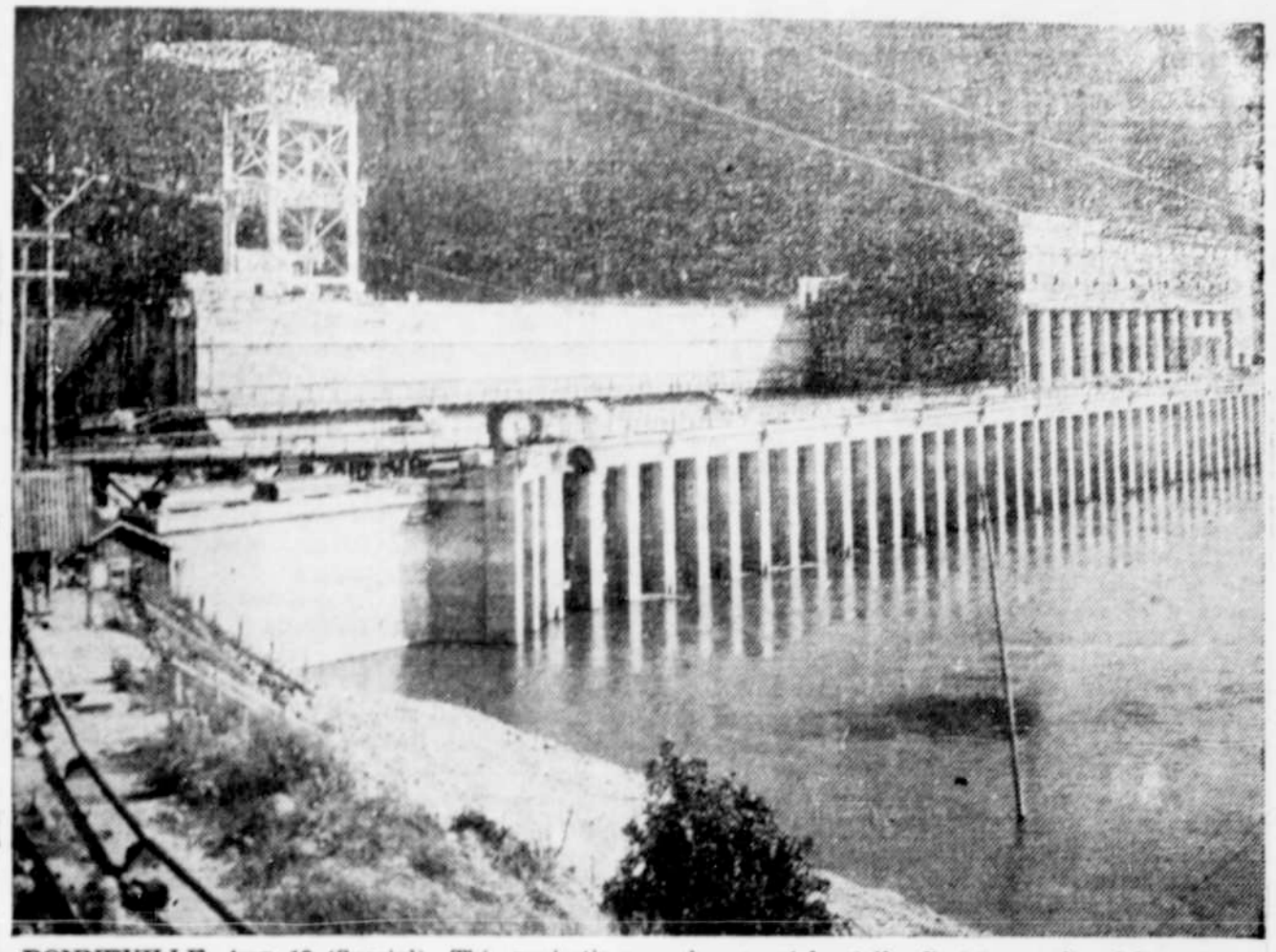


Bonneville Powerhouse Taking Final Form



BONNEVILLE, Aug. 12 (Special)—This project's powerhouse—at least the first two units of it—wears an almost completed aspect, with pouring of roof concrete all but ended and interior installations proceeding rapidly. The Columbia, now flowing a mere 150,000 cubic feet per second, is much more placid than it was three months ago, when the flow was more than triple the present figure.
