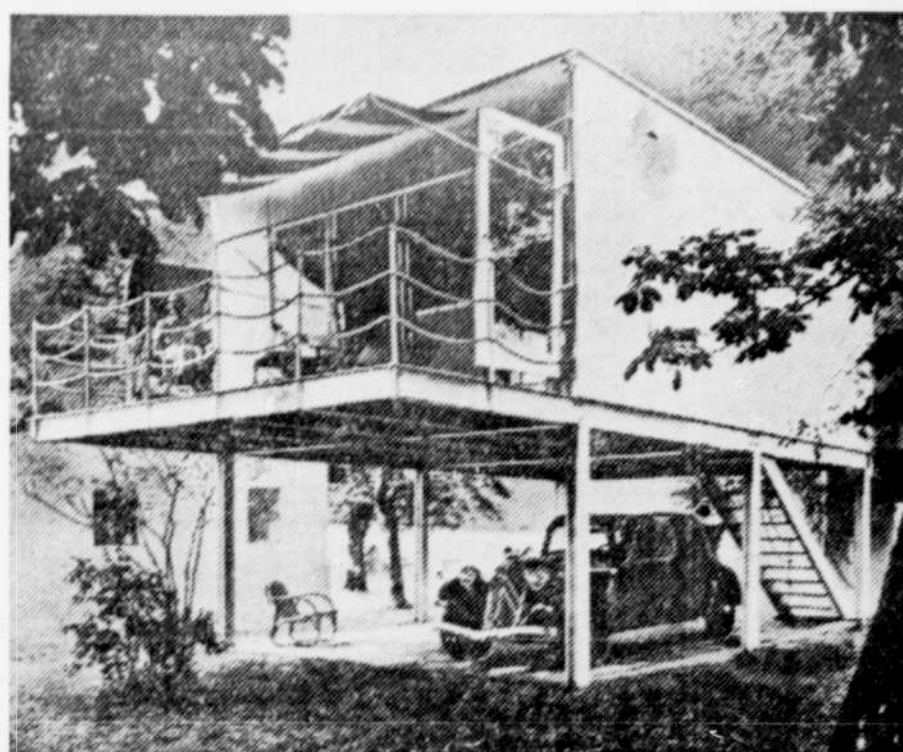


Crippled War Veterans Pray for Peace
