Legion Hits Optional ROTC Bill

At their last meeting members of Bonneville post, No. 88, American Legion, passed a resolution opposing passage of the optional military training bill, and requested its publication. The resolution follows:

Whereas: Through petitions and campaigns a small number of persons, comprising small groups of pacifists, radicals and malcontents, have had placed on the ballot for the coming general election in Oregon a referendum which, if passed, will do away with the compulsory military training in our colleges and universities and will place the same on an optional basis; and

Whereas: The source of this movement against compulsory military training in our schools is not in Oregon but was started in New York by a few persons who have carried it forward and have rallied to their banner many well-meaning, patriotic but sadly misguided citizens who are led to believe that such training provokes a war spirit; and

Whereas: There has been no demand for a change in this training by those directly affected, practically all of the students being proud of their military departments, recognizing the value of the educational features and wishing no tampering with the present system; and

Whereas: Military officials who conduct the R.O.T.C. courses are not doing so with the idea of promoting war, as radicals would have us believe, but are supervising the students in learning the fundamentals so that if a war should come they will be ready to protect themselves and defend their country; it being understood, of course, that in the event of war all men physically fit and of certain ages are compelled to go whether they are prepared or not; and

Whereas: It is the duty of every citizen to be ready, if need be, to defend his country, and it is right and proper that preparation for performance of that duty should be a part of education, especially in colleges and universities supported by the taxpayers; and

Whereas: The American Legion believes that the destruction of civilian education in soldiery will necessitate the building of a big standing army and militaristic type of national defense:

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved that

Bonneville Post No. 88, American Legion, of Bonneville, Oregon, go on record as being strongly opposed to the abolition of compulsory military training in the colleges and univer-

sities of the State of Oregon; and
Be It Further Resolved that

Bonneville Post No. 88, American Legion, brings before the people in their community, in the state of Oregon, this abuse of the referendum and imposition on the voters in asking them to pass upon a matter of school administration, as is being brought about by a small body of malcontents, urge all voters to not be misled by a small minority group, and to support the present law by voting "NO" on Referendum No. 309 on the ballot at the coming election on November 3rd, 1936.

Unanimously approved by the members of Bonneville Post No. 88, American Legion, in regular meeting assembled, October 14, 1936; copy of this resolution being ordered sent to the local post of the Veterans of Foreign Wars; newspapers, Dam Chronicle, Mid-Columbia and Spillway; Parent-Teacher Association; and Cascade Locks Chamber of Commerce.

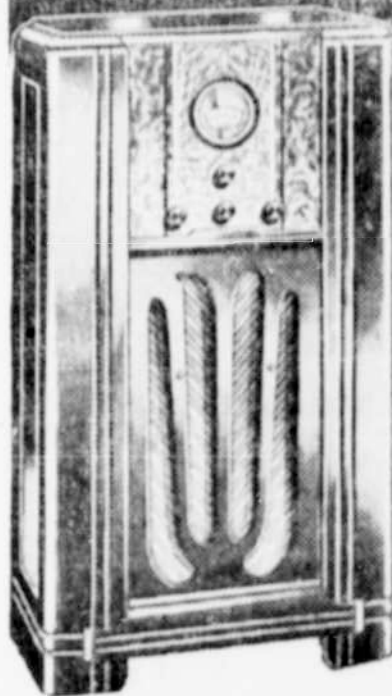
