At The Roosevelt

In the same type of role which vaulted her to fame when she played in "The Trial of Mary Dugan" on Broadway, Ann Harding captures new honors in "The Witness Chair," scheduled at the Roosevelt theater in Bonneville Friday and Saturday, November 20 and 21.

Her role is wholly and tensely dramatic, with supporting players adding comedy bits which set off the climax in stronger relief.

Walter Abel does handsomely opposite Miss Harding as the man who is tried for a crime she committed. Abel's business partner is found slain in his office, and circumstantial evidence has it that Abel did the slaughtering. The courtroom reveals one astonishing angle after another, topped by Miss Harding's startling confession.

RKO Radio has surrounded Ann Harding with a cast of proved ability, including Douglas Dumbrille, Moroni Olsen, Margaret Hamilton and others as accomplished.

Tropic Trouble

One woman can do strange things to the lives of two men, and Barbara Stanwyck proves it in "His Brother's Wife," a powerful film coming to the Roosevelt theater Sunday, Monday and Tuesday, November 22, 23, and 24.

Robert Taylor is one of the men, and John Eldredge is the other.

Taylor is a brilliant young scientist who is due to leave for South America on a research expedition when he meets Miss Stanwyck. He promises to give up the bugs and heat and stay in New York with her. But Taylor's brother, Eldredge, shows him how foolish he would be to throw away his big chance in return for doubtful happiness with a woman he has known only a few days, so Taylor packs up and leaves.

Miss Stanwyck, furious, accepts a job steering suckers into a gambling dive, and later falls in love with Eldredge and marries him.

Much of the later action takes place in the jungles of South America, where Taylor and a small band of scientists are laboring to find a serum for spotted fever. Taylor has tried to save his brother from ruin by inducing Miss Stanwyck to join him in South America, and there she vindicates Taylor's love by developing fine traits of character. Eldredge meanwhile has obtained divorce on grounds of desertion, leaving the door open to romance between the two.

Director W. S. Van Dyke has done a splendid job of putting the show together, although much of the credit belongs to an able supporting cast which includes Joseph Calleia, Jean Hersholt, Jed Prouty and William Stack.

Guzzling Dick

Under the frank and informal title, "Meet Nero Wolfe," Columbia Pictures introduces Rex Stout's famous fat detective in the first screen adaptation of the sleuth's widely read fictional adventures. The new film shows at the Roosevelt theater on Wednesday and Thursday, November 25 and 26.

Edward Arnold, rotund giant familiar as "Diamond Jim" Brady and John Sutter in "Sutter's Gold," takes the title role. A fine actor who can be stormy and genial by turns, Arnold plays to perfection the part of the beer-sluicing detective who solves crimes by sitting at home with a bottle of brew, using other people's eyes, hands and legs, and his own brains, in the solution.

Lionel Stander is his "man Friday," the big, tough boy who can do what he's told without asking why.

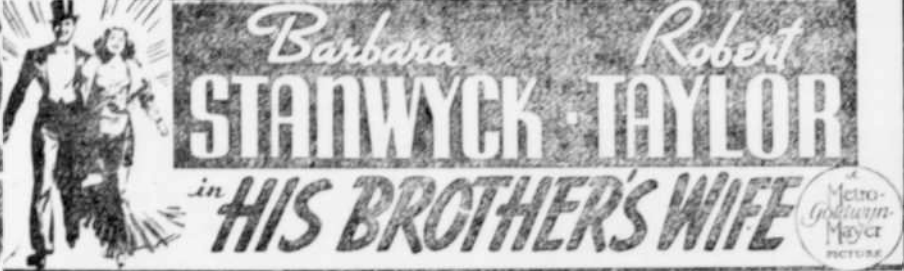
