At The Roosevelt

An old rancher who makes his blacksnake bull whip, "Emma," his only weapon, and holds guns in contempt, makes his bow in the latest of the thrill-packed "Hopalong Cassidy" westerns, "Heart of the West," scheduled Friday and Saturday, December 18 and 19, at the Roosevelt theater in Bonneville.

Familiar by now to every patron of the Roosevelt theater are Bill Boyd, hard-bitten hombre who plays the part of Clarence E. Mulford's popular hero, "Hopalong Cassidy," Jimmy Ellison, who plays the part of Hopalong's romantic pal, Johnny Nelson; and George Hayes, known best as "Windy," the old rancher.

Produced by Harry Sherman for Paramount, this film, sixth of the Hopalong series, recounts how Boyd and Ellison round up a gang of rustlers who are operating through a canyon on the property of a newly-arrived easterner.

Something New

Publicity writers combed the dictionary in their quest for words that would describe Simone Simon, continental star who created a stir—a great big stir—with her first American picture, "Girl's Dormitory," billed at the Roosevelt theater Sunday, Monday and Tuesday, December 20, 21 and 22.

The story chronicles the first love of a beautiful young girl immured in a girls' school. Herbert Marshall is the object of her affections, and she soars to sudden paradise when they kiss during a summer storm. Then she learns that Marshall, who is head of the school, is really in love with another woman—Miss Chatterton.

That's where the fireworks start, and where Miss Simon gets a chance to show her wares.
