Travelers' Aid

Automobile accidents on the nation's highways are becoming so numerous that the American Red Cross is establishing a nation-wide chain of "Emergency Stations" along principal highways, most of them in filling stations or cabin camps. At each emergency station two of the regular attendants are required to take a 15-hour first-aid course given by a local physician on authorization of the Red Cross. When that course is satisfactorily completed, the local Red Cross chapter supplies the station with bandages, splins, antiseptics and a directory of local doctors and hospitals. Red Cross Emergency Station signs are then posted along the highway.
