Agriculturists Seek Better Conditions

PORTLAND, January 26. — Co-ordinated action by nurserymen in all parts of Oregon to gain necessary action, both legislative and in business fields, was the keynote of discussions of the Oregon Association of Nurserymen's mid-winter meeting at the Multnomah hotel here.

"We must have organization to carry forward our legislative needs, solve our quarantine problems and bring about better business conditions," declared Earl Houseweart of Woodburn, president of the association.

Members of the association will back a bill before the legislature for \$7500 to carry ahead experimental work in insect and disease problems in this field, Mr. Houseweart pointed out.

Agriculture represents more than 50 per cent of the business in Oregon yet receives far from that total of benefits in relation to other fields in legislative appropriations each year, according to Solon T. White, head of the Oregon state department of agriculture.

Other speakers included: William Courtney, United States entomologist from Sumner, Wash.; Paul Carpenter, Oregon State college extension agricultural economist; Henry Reynolds, Washington agricultural economist, and Frank McKennon of the Oregon department of agriculture. They led discussions on pest control, marketing, licensing and quarantine trends.

Recipes

Chicken Tamale Pie

Boil one old chicken until tender. To the broth add—

- 1 can corn
- 1 can tomatoes, strained
- 1/2 pound butter and a little oil, depending on fatness of chicken
- 2 Tablesp. Chili powder
- 2 or 3 pieces garlic, chopped fine
- Thicken above with corn meal (yellow) until a stiff mush. Boil few minutes, stirring constantly.
- Add chicken, cut in pieces
- 4 hard boiled eggs
- 4 raw eggs, well beaten
- 1 can ripe olives, cut as desired
- Salt and a dash of cayenne pepper
- Bake for 30 minutes.
