**NOTICE:**  
To All Truck Drivers and Owners--

Owing to frost conditions on county roads, the following load limits of combined weight of truck and load are now in force and will remain in force until cancelled on all roads in Hood River county:

Trucks with dual tires over 7 inches—Eight tons, 16,000 pounds.

Trucks with dual tires, 6 inches and under—Six tons, 12,000 pounds.

Trucks with single tires, 6 inches and under—Four tons, 8,000 pounds.

Failure to observe these regulations will render offender subject to prosecution.
