12 TIMES MARRIED



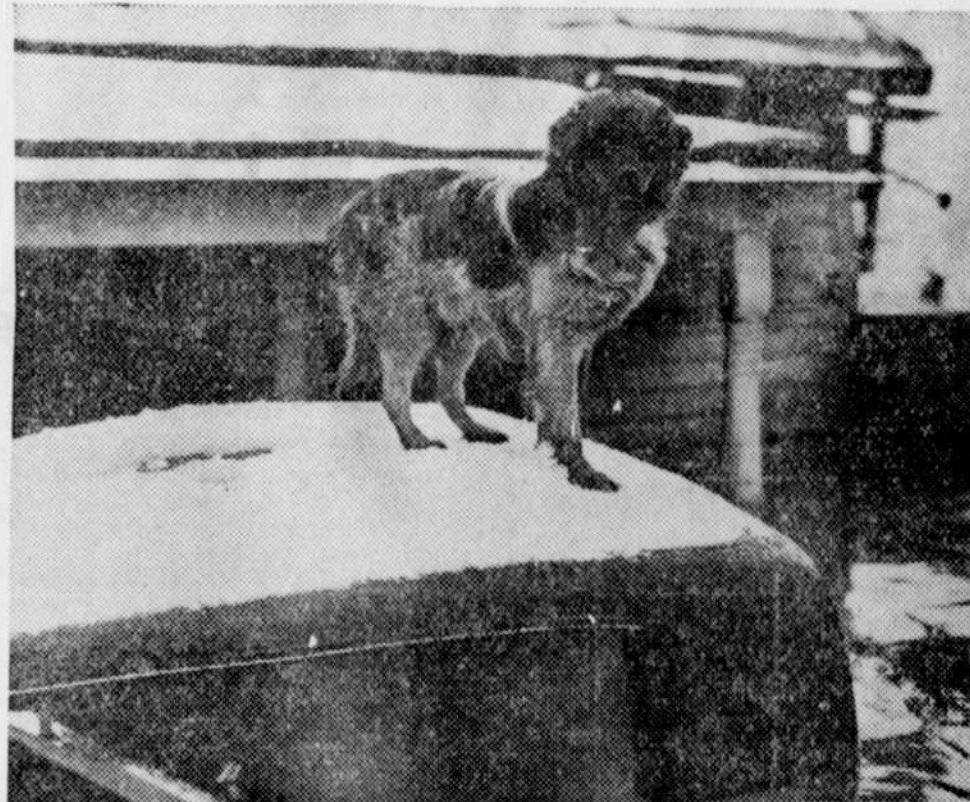
