Boy Scouts Celebrate 28th Anniversary of Founding



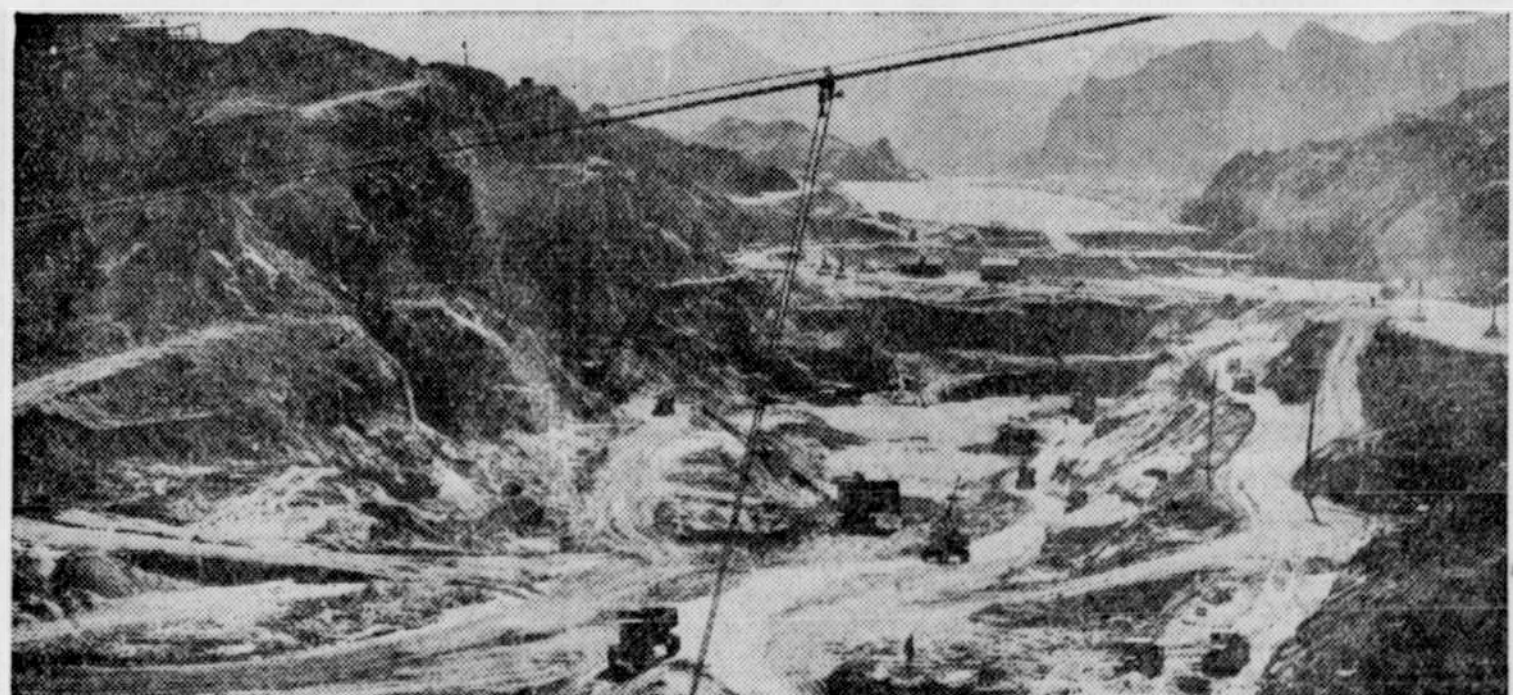

Construction of Mammoth Parker Dam Undertaken



Excavation for the foundation of Parker dam on the Colorado river, 155 miles below Boulder dam, has begun. Photograph shows the unwatered section of the Colorado river at the damsite. The view was taken looking downstream from the California side. Parker dam, which will re-regulate the Colorado river below Lake Mead and will divert water into the aqueduct of the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California for transmission to Los Angeles, will be a 340-foot concrete arch structure. It will impound 700,000 acre-feet of water.
