

\$75,233,300 Requested For Bonneville

The war department in a report to the house rivers and harbors committee asserted this week that it would cost \$75,233,300 to complete the Bonneville navigation and power project on the Columbia river.

In a detailed study of the proposal to create a "TVA for the Northwest," the war department said that \$50,579,000 would be needed for development of the power proposal, including 10 generating units, and \$24,654,300 for navigation purposes.

The war department submitted also a table of suggested power rates, which would amortize the costs over a 50-year period, through sales at the switchboard.

These ranged from three mills per 100,000 kilowatt-hour per month to 1,000,000 kilowatt-hour per month at one half mill, while the schedule provided a demand charge of 60 cents per kilowatt-hour contracted per month.

The committee was told that first plans include the completion of the navigation facilities, construction of a power house, and two generating units, and laying the foundations for four others.

The cost of this work was estimated at \$50,711,200, of which the reservoir and dam would cost \$30,067,000 and fishways \$7,077,200. In figuring costs of the power program, the department allocated half of the dam, fishways, buildings and ground expenditures to power development and the other half to navigation.

The committee is awaiting reports from the federal power commission and the interior department on the administration-backed Smith bill to establish a Columbia River authority along lines similar to the T. V. A. before resuming hearings.

Representative Martin Smith, democrat, of Washington, author of the measure, has accepted a proposed change by the war department to give it supervision over power generated to a "switchboard." The original proposal was that the interior department should have the control.

TAXES COME IN

Property taxes of the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company in Hood River county, totaling \$4000.54, with the discount for prompt payment, were paid this week according to Mrs. Manda Collins, manager for the company.

Total taxes, including ad valorem, federal, franchise and miscellaneous, for the company in Oregon on its 1936 operations will be \$1,086,526. This amounts to an average of 72 cents per month per telephone, based on the average number of telephones in service in 1936, Mrs. Collins said.

Sanitation Drive Begins in Valley

E. E. Francis of the United States bureau of public health and sanitation told the Sun this week that Hood River county ranchers should immediately take advantage of the offer of construction of rest houses through the WPA, at a price near cost.

In order to eliminate spread of disease among agricultural workers, and possible contamination of food-stuffs, state inspectors will visit all parts of the state this year and condemn farm rest houses which do not meet rigid requirements — namely, that they be flyproof, mosquitoproof and odorless.

The houses may be ordered either through any county lumber company or through George Roberts, telephone 5676.

The campaign is part of a program of sanitation begun under President Hoover, when horrible conditions in the southern states were attacked. Since then scope has been widened, until at present there is a similar project in every state. The bureau of public health and sanitation is a permanent establishment, and Mr. Francis hopes to be at work in Hood

River and Wasco counties for a long period.

About 11 men will be employed in Hood River county in constructing and installing the houses, at the start, with more to be employed later.
