First Lady Meets a Newcomer



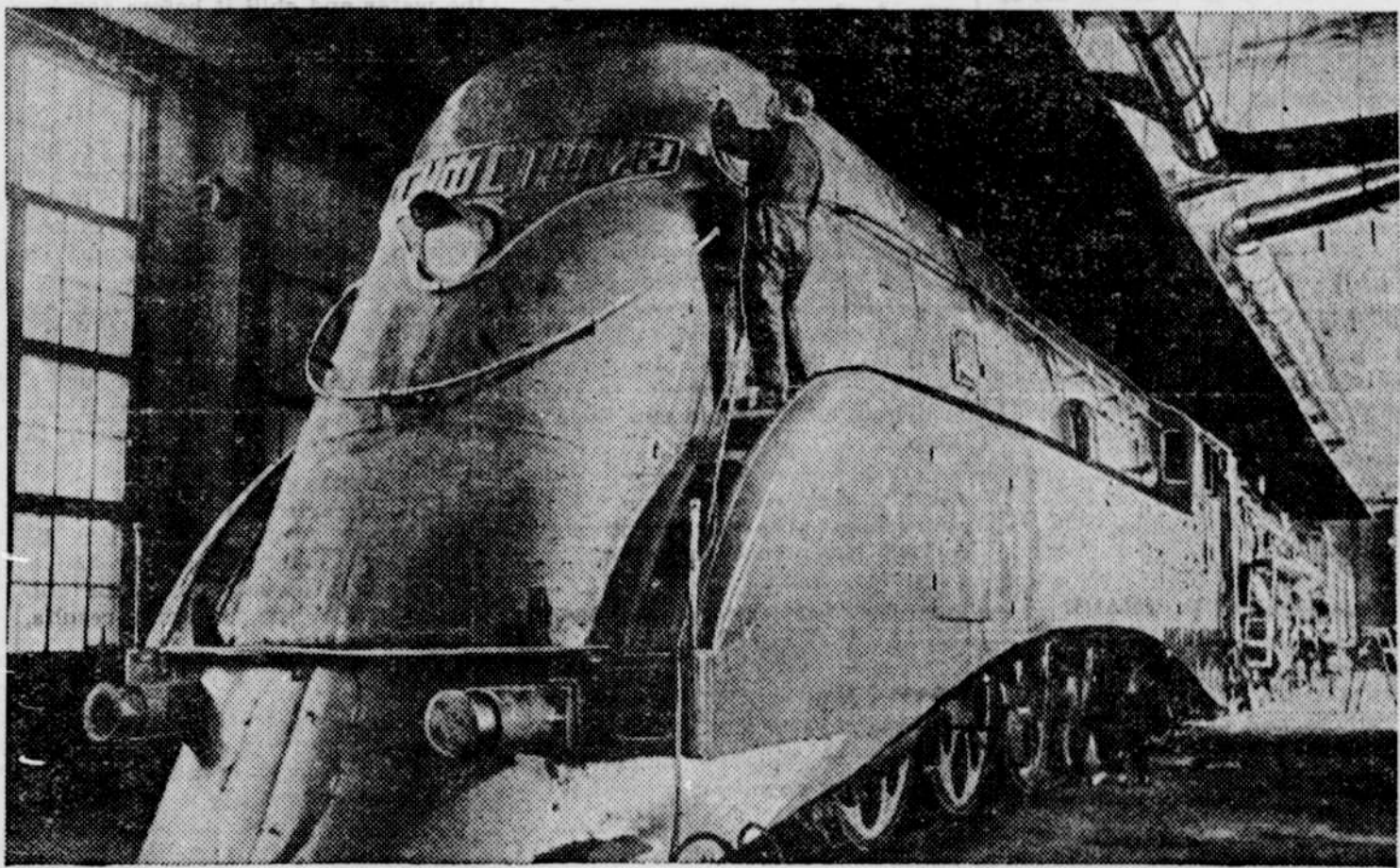

Russia Is Streamlining Its Locomotives



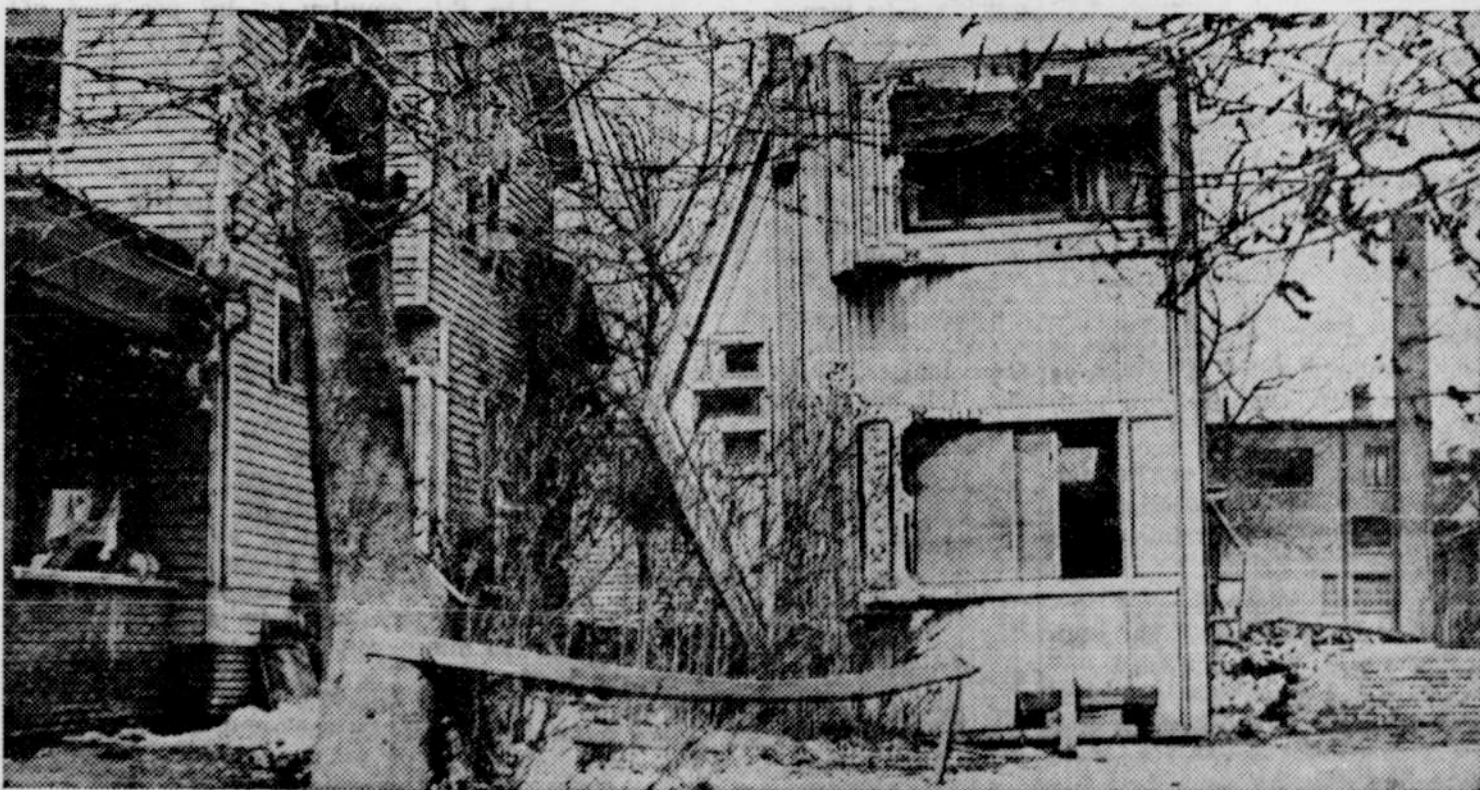
