"Hideaway Girl" is a mystery story, but it is garnished with excellent music and dancing. In light-hearted vein, it tells about a jewel robbery, perpetrated on the scene of a marriage ceremony by a female thief disguised as the bride. The police radio alarm gives the number of an automobile in which the thief escaped, and it is the car in which Miss Ross rides in the opening sequences. She meets Cummings at a gas station, and when a police car comes up, flees with him. She takes refuge on his yacht where they are forced to pose as man and wife until the real thief is revealed. Before that, however, love blooms between them—to the tune of some of the season's sprightliest music.

### Light and Bright

One of the finest casts of musicians, comedians, dancers and singers ever assembled for a motion picture makes its appearance in "Champagne Waltz," the gay comedy with music which will play Wednesday and Thursday at the Roosevelt theatre.

Fred MacMurray and Gladys Swarthout, who are co-starred, not only supply the romantic interest, but also exhibit the talents which have made them famous as musicians. Before MacMurray's entrance into films he was a saxophone player of considerable note. And in "Champagne Waltz," as the leader of a swing band which takes Vienna by storm, he toots his saxophone again in real swing fashion. He also sings "When Is a Kiss Not a Kiss" to Miss Swarthout.

The famous Metropolitan Opera diva contributes two outstanding vocal selections. The first is the new swing-waltz hit "The Merry-Go-Round," and the second "Could I Be in Love?"

Irrepressible Jack Oakie is responsible for most of the comedy as the press agent of MacMurray's band, and more laughter is provided by Herman Bing, Ernest Cossart, Benny Baker, and others. Frank Forest, the new screen "find," also provides some vocal music.

Veloz and Yolanda, world-famed ballroom dance team, supply several solos, one to the strains of "The Merry-Go-Round," in which they interpret a carousel in dance form, and another in formal ball-room waltz. A chorus of 350 also perform to the "Merry-Go-Round Waltz," while an additional chorus re-enacts the old-fashioned waltz of Vienna.

Two bands—one a hot American swing band, under the baton of MacMurray, and the other a symphonic ensemble which interprets the waltz, supply the music.

### Newcomer Scores

A new film personality of exceptional dramatic and emotional ability will be introduced at the Roosevelt theatre Sunday, Monday and Tuesday when the motion picture version of Barry Benefield's best-selling novel, "Valiant Is the Word for Carrie," will be shown.

The newcomer is Gladys George, famed stage actress, whose portrayal of the woman of shady repute who is resurrected and ennobled by two little children she adopted, is one of the finest things ever captured by the camera and is certain to become one of the most widely discussed film roles of the season.

Miss George, as Carrie Snyder, brings up two homeless waifs as her own. Through great sacrifice and over the greatest obstacles she rears them to glorious young manhood and womanhood. If she doesn't fight it she goes to jail but her past will remain a secret. The way in which she makes her decision is a powerful and dramatic motion picture performance which moves Miss George at once into the company of the greatest actors of the screen.

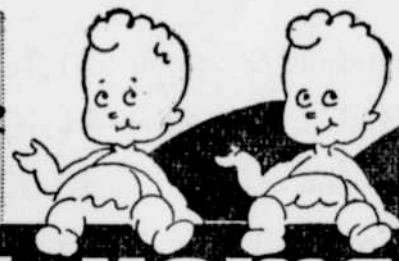
