

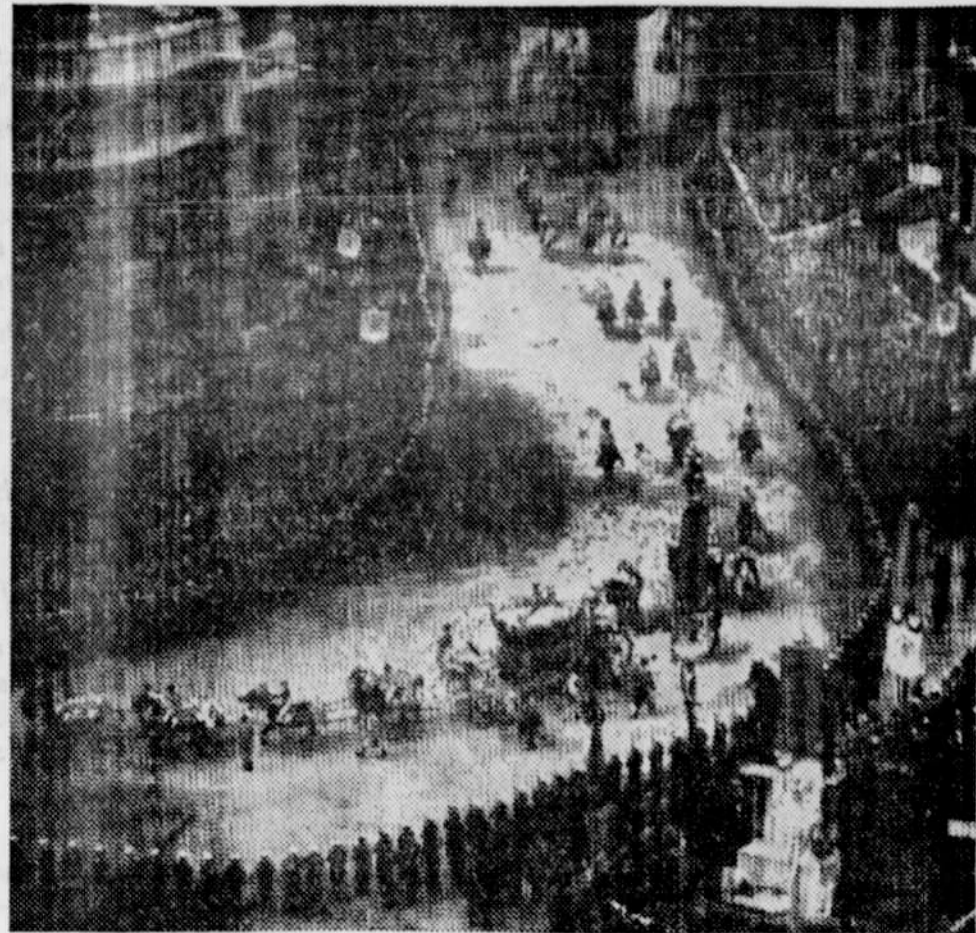
Crowned King and Queen of England

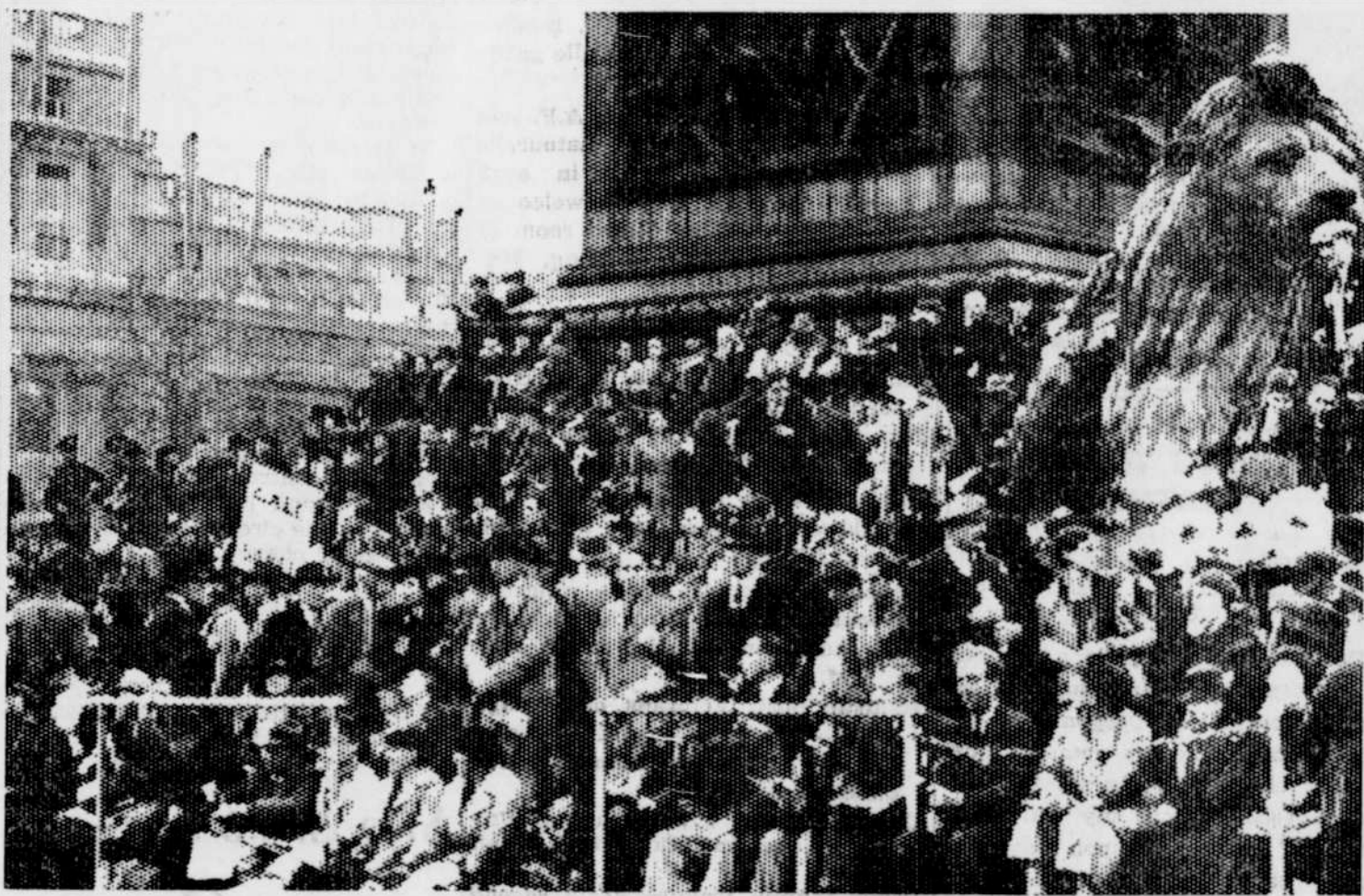

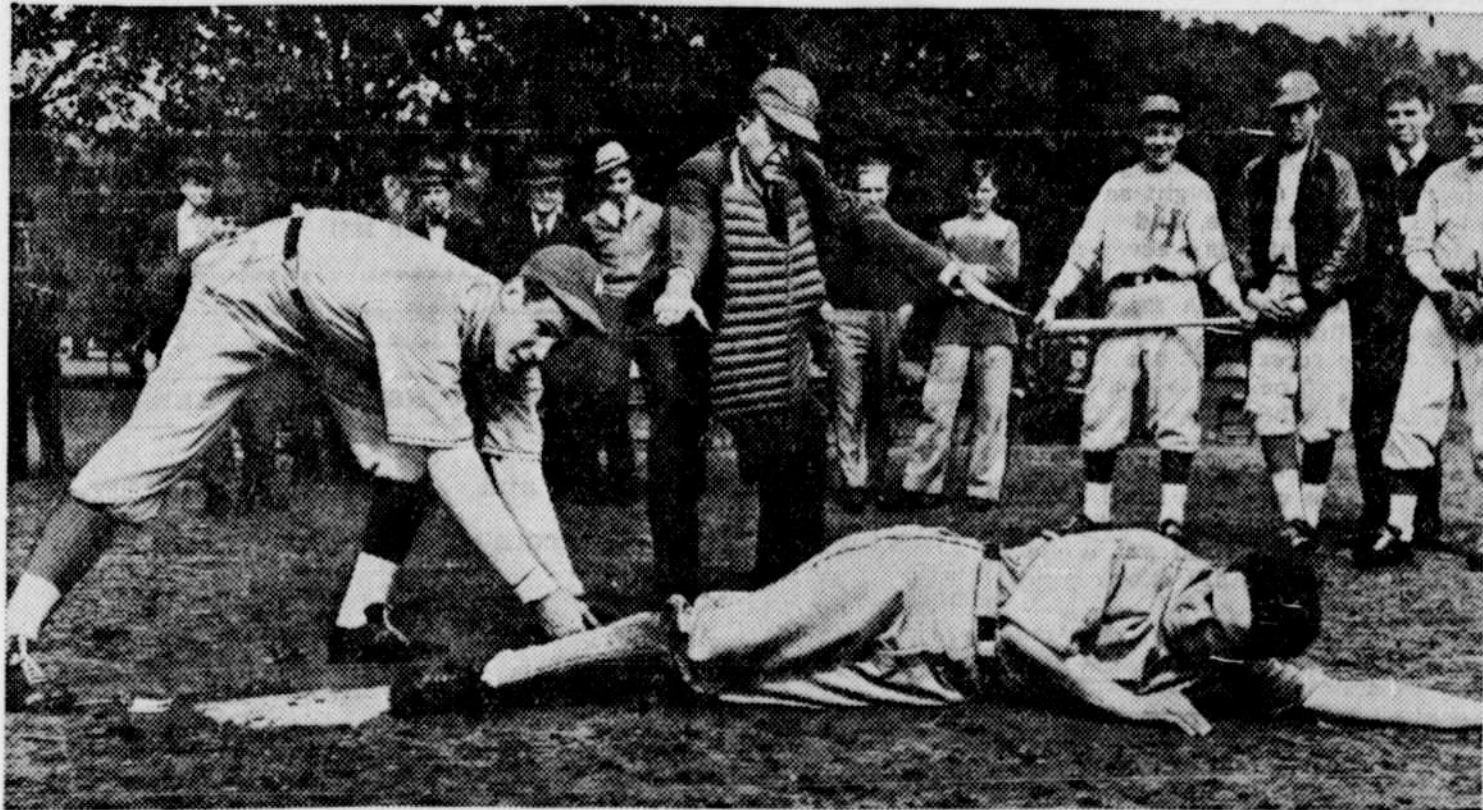

London.—King George VI, newly crowned, as he appeared to the throngs after coronation.

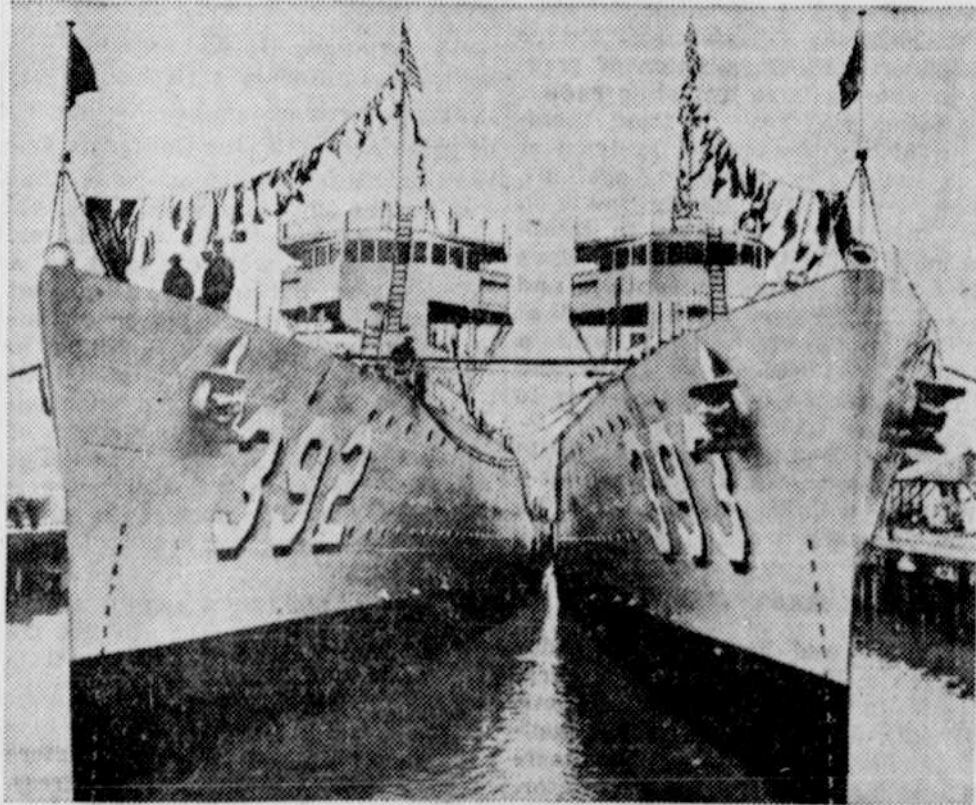
