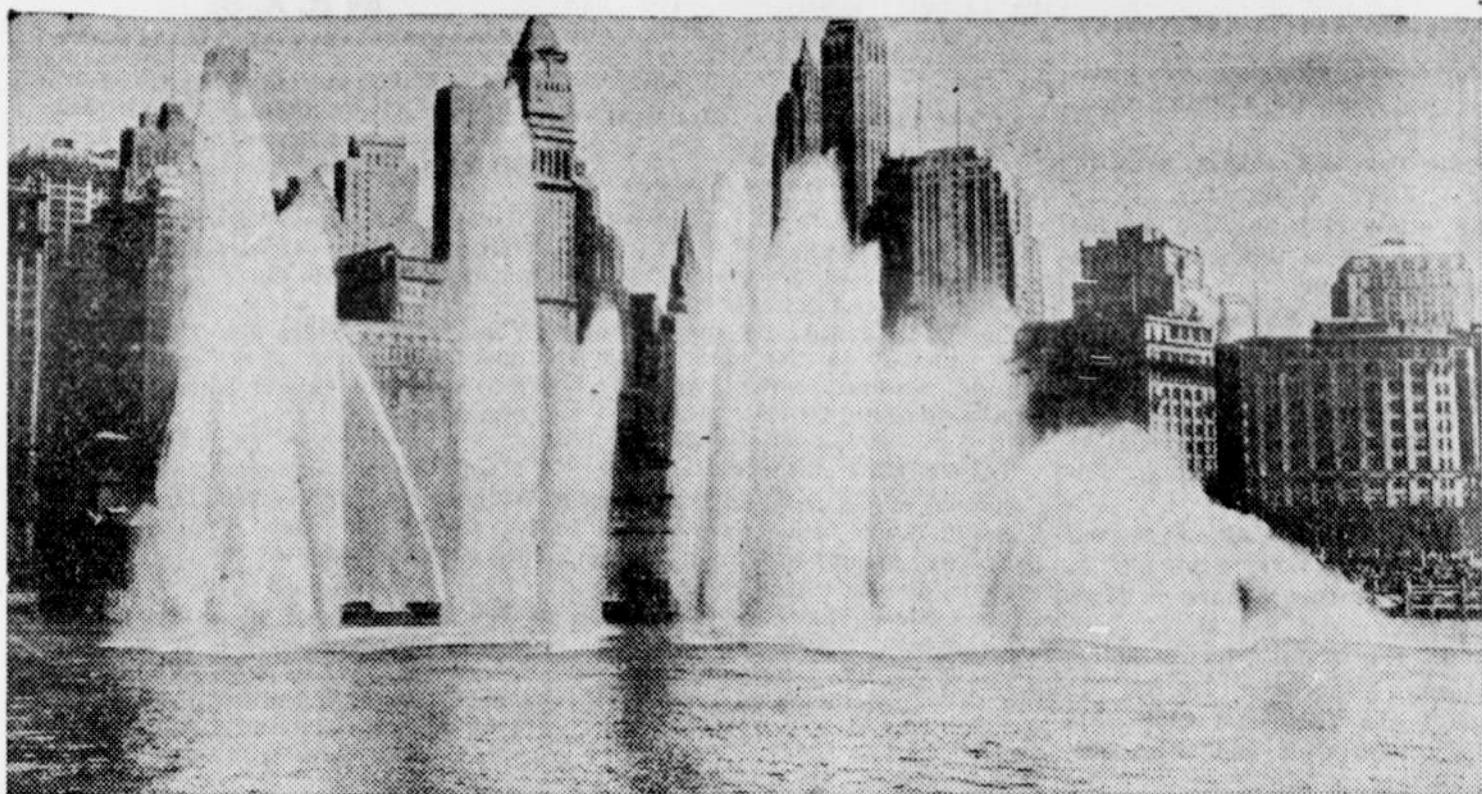


Fire Department Creates Manhattan Geysers

Maj. Berry Takes Oath as Senator



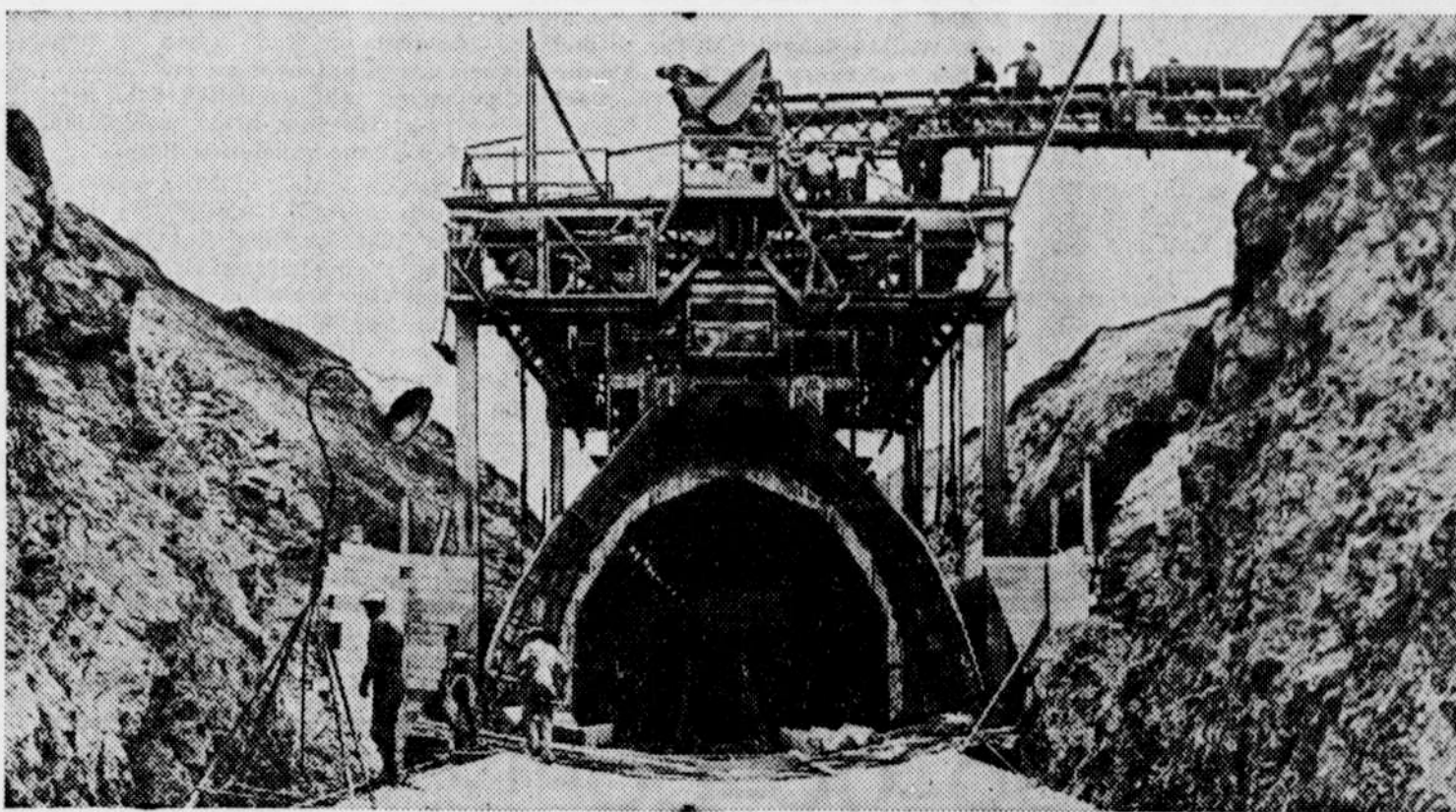
