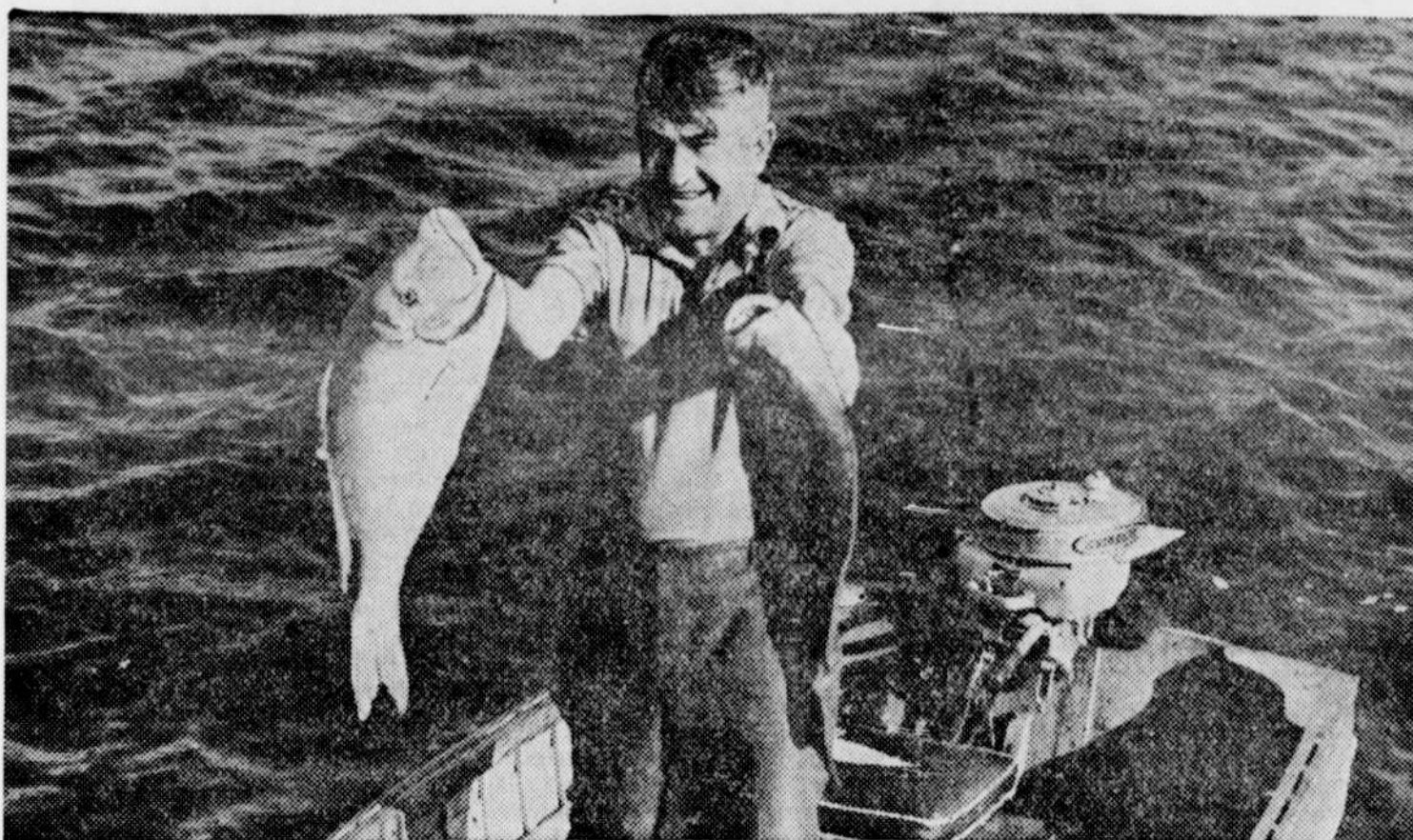


Big Ones Are Biting This Fishing Season

Confederate Vets Recall Days of '61



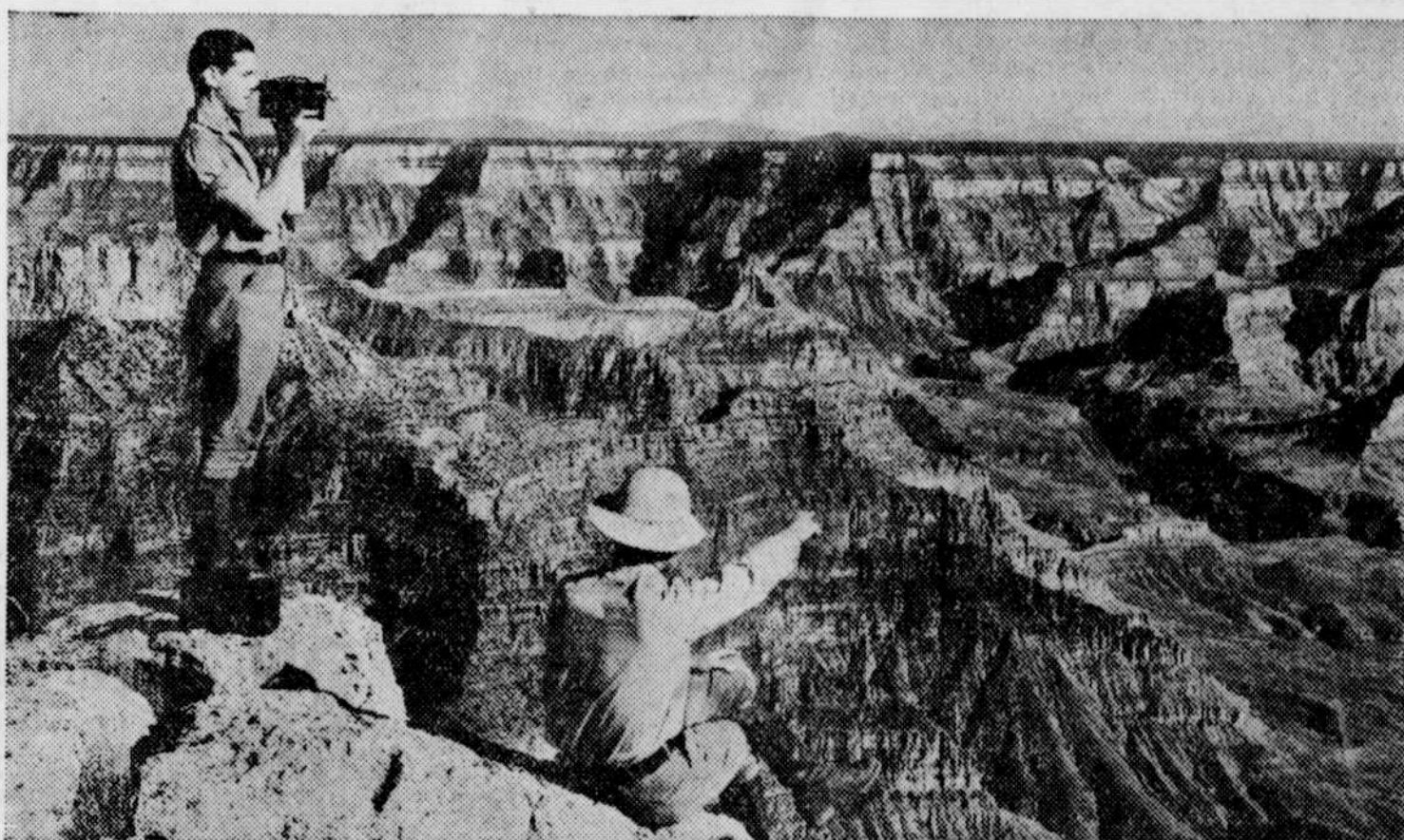
