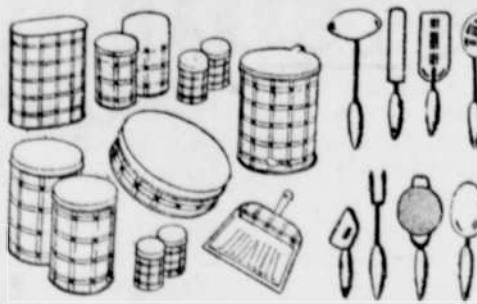

100 Conquer Mount Hood on Legion Climb

Harassed by lightning, sulphur fumes, rain, and fog, 27 members of the flare and short wave gangs came through valiantly Saturday night to stage the fireworks and mountain illumination that preceeded the 17th Annual Mount Hood Climb. Thunder clouds rolled over the mountain about 4:30 in the afternoon, loosing lightning so closely as to make the men's hair stand on end, and sparks jump from their fingers.

Equally dangerous were the sulphur fumes stirred up from the mountain's crater. These floated about in clouds, sickening all who came in contact with them.

At 5 o'clock, climb officials decided to cancel the climb due to the treacherous conditions, but improved weather and the heroic advance work of Crag Rats and others made it possible for the Climb to be held.

And a glorious time was had by all the day of the climb. Ninety-three persons, accompanied by nine Crag Rats who acted as guides, reached the top of Mount Hood Sunday and found it was just a matter of taking one step after another, and there you are.
