

CCC Removes Quota Limit On Local Boys

All quota restrictions for the enrollment of boys into Civilian Conservation Camps have been lifted, the county relief office has announced, and any boy between the ages of 18 and 21 in the Pacific Northwest now has the opportunity of joining the organization.

Heretofore, various relief rules and regulations have restricted the entrance of many boys into the CCC, but the bars have been let down, and the government wishes to enroll as many as possible from this section of this country.

Youths should apply for enrollment by Thursday, July 29, as they must be in Vancouver, Wn. for the new term on July 31. Those interested may register at the county relief office at 2nd and Oak streets in Hood River.

Rate of pay for CCC members is \$30 a month, of which \$25 must be sent to parents. Boys must make their own arrangements for transportation to Vancouver.

Recipes

Berry Dumplings: 2 cups flour; 4 teaspoons baking powder; ¼ teaspoon salt; 4 tablespoons fat; 2/3 cup cold water.

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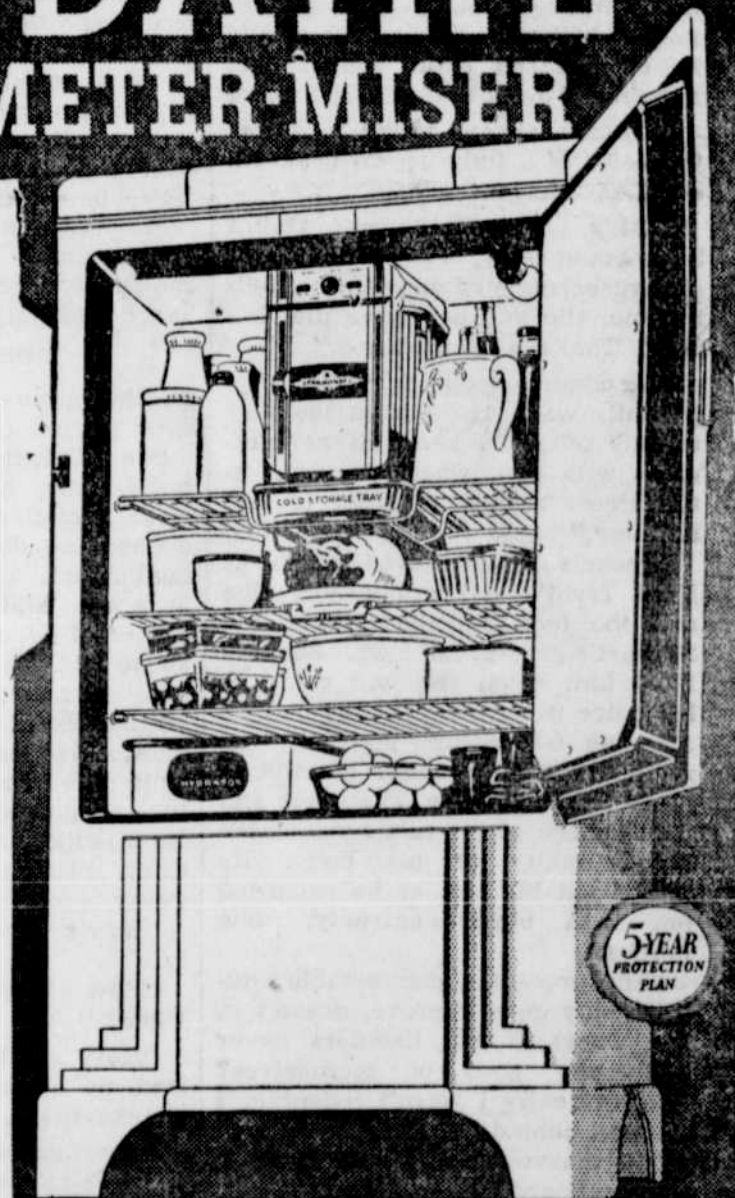
