



## FISH NOTES

After spending a week at Lost Lake, I feel qualified to give a very authoritative report on fishing there. It is really very good. I caught a number of trout ranging up to 10 and 11 inches in length.

Steelheads and jack salmon are being caught in the lower Hood River. Fishing at Celilo is variable, but on some days fine steelheads and Chinook are being caught. Good fly fishing is reported on the Lower Lake Branch, fish of seven or eight inches being hooked. The lakes on Mt. De-

fiance are unfortunately not producing results. This is probably due to the large quantities of fingerlings that have been released there, and hence satisfying the appetites of the larger fish.

No report was received on Central Oregon angling for this week.

At the regular monthly meeting of the School Board, John Hutson was given the bus contract for transporting Oak Grove children. He will handle this route in addition to that of Barrett, which he had last year. Hutson will replace Roy Crapper, who had notified the board he would not be available the coming year.

### Eagle Creek Is Popular

A total of 13,380 visitors used the Eagle Creek picnic and camp grounds during the month of July, according to figures released by Albert Wiesendanger, senior forest ranger there. This was an increase of 4367 over those stopping at the camp in July of 1936. A total of 33,165 have visited there since the first of April.
