Morris Quoted As Giving Ross Support

Word received in Oregon recently announced that Senator George W. Norris of Nebraska is for J. D. Ross of Seattle as administrator of Bonneville Dam. Senator Robert M. La Follette Jr. of Wisconsin is also behind Ross for the post, word received by the People's Power League indicates.

Senator Norris, dean of the Congress and father of the Tennessee Valley Authority, is said to be one of the president's most intimate advisors on power problems.

Although the Nebraska senator, who is 76 years old, is ill in a Wisconsin backwoods village, Judson H. King, secretary of the National Popular Government League, has announced that Norris favors Ross for the Bonneville post.

BIDS CALLED ON JOBS

Bids for new jobs are quite a subject for discussion these days. Yesterday bids were opened for the big job in The Dalles and today bids are being opened on the Ruckel Tunnel finishing job.

Before long bids will be called on the levee and protective works on Hood River for the Mt. Hood Railroad. This, it is estimated, will run around \$55,000.

On August 31 bids are called for rip-rapping of the Washington shore from the dam to Sheridan point to protect the S. P. and S. tracks. This job is estimated to run around \$85,000.

Lumber Small Part Of Building Cost

Contrary to general opinion, the cost of lumber is not the major expense in building a modern home, says Professor L. J. Smith, head of the Department of Agricultural Engineering at Washington State College.

Studies of costs averaged from data compiled from 20 recently constructed modern homes by the Southern Pine Association, show that the cost of mill work, lumber, flooring, and roofing averages a little over 25 per cent of the total cost of the home. The carpentry runs from 18 to 19 per cent; plumbing from 8 to 9 per cent; excavation, foundations, and concrete 8 to 9 per cent; paint 6½ per cent; plastering 5 per cent; brick work 3½ to 4 per cent; wiring 2 per cent; hardware 2 per cent; lighting fixtures 1½ to 2 per cent; and sheet metal 1 per cent. The remainder is the contractor's expense and profit.

It is thus seen that the expense of building a modern home is spread out over a large number of industries, and gives work to a wide variety of labor.
