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4-H Fair Plans Are Nearing Completion

Preparations are nearing completion for the annual 4-H School Fair of Hood River County, to be held at the Hood River Junior High School Tuesday and Wednesday, August 31-September 1. Directing the big event are County School Superintendent L. B. Gibson and County Agent A. L. Marble.

The program is divided into two main classifications — livestock and home arts, the latter part being under the direction of Mrs. George Alexander. Numerous prizes are offered for champion livestock, including a \$100 scholarship to Oregon State College, being sponsored jointly by O. S. C. and the Union Pacific railroad for the boy or girl chosen as the "best club worker."

Four other boys and girls with the next highest ratings will be given free trips to the Oregon State Fair at Salem. First and second winners in the Livestock Judging Contest will compete at the State Fair and the Pacific International Exposition in Portland.

Half scholarships to the 4-H Club Summer School have been offered by the First National Bank, the Rotary

Club, the Business and Professional Women's Club, the Hood River Garden Club, the Parkdale Potato Growers' Association, the County Granges, and the Hood River County Sun. Sixteen clubs, some of them in several divisions, will offer projects and exhibits on the following subjects: pigs, sheep, dairy and beef cattle, poultry, rabbits, bees, forestry, handicraft, corn, potatoes, gardens, cooking, sewing, homemaking, canning, and flowers.

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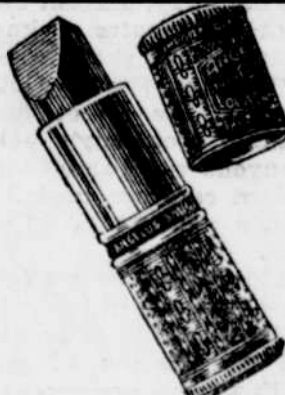
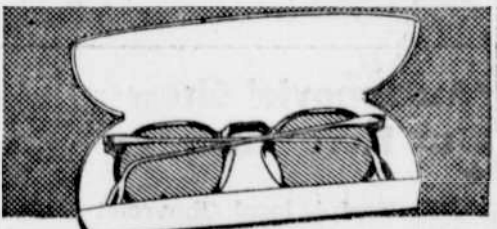


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
