Present Time Ideal For Fertilizing Lawn

(By Gordon G. Brown)

Now is a good time to apply a supplementary nitrogen fertilizer to your lawn, especially if it is turning brown or tending to dry up. For this purpose, Sulphate of Ammonia, applied at the rate of 150 pounds per acre is recommended. This should be applied uniformly (preferably after the sun has gone down) either dry or in solution. Where applied dry, pulverize thoroughly.

Caution. A concentrated solution of Sulphate of Ammonia at this season on grass foliage will seriously burn if allowed to remain long, especially during hot weather. Sprinkle the lawn thoroughly after applying fertilizer to eliminate this hazard. Where the work is properly

done, a noticeable improvement in the green color of lawns should be apparent within two or three weeks. The cost is small and the benefits large. This application is not intended to replace, but rather supplement regular fertilizer applications, which are applied in either spring or fall.

Phosphate of Ammonia (16-20 formula) at the rate of 200 pounds per acre is also recommended. Where used now, apply as suggested for Sulphate of Ammonia.
