HIGH SCHOOL STARS ON WEBFOOT TEAM

EUGENE, ORE., Oct. 25.—Oregon high school stars are filling most of the important roles in the University of Oregon's varsity football campaign this fall with home staters dominating the 1937 Webfoot squad more strongly than ever before.

Led by eight former Portland prep stars, the Oregon contingent numbers 27 of the top-ranking 40 squad members. California, usually represented by a high percentage of players, claims only seven this year. The others come from Washington (four), British Columbia and Nebraska.

Portland's contributions to Callison's squad are Captain Tony Amato, Washington high; Denny Braid, Erling Jacobsen, centers, Jefferson; Ron Husk, guard, Franklin; John Yerby, end, and Dale Lasselle, half-back, Grant; Dennis Donovan, quarter, Benson, and Russ Inskeep, tackle, Hill Military academy.

Outside of Portland, Oregon's best hot-bed of prospects is Klamath Falls, which has four men on the squad. They are Nello Giovanini and Chan Berry, guards; Bill Estes, tackle, and Victor Reginato, end.

GINGERBREAD GOES BAVARIAN



SPICY, tender gingerbread topped with a firm, shimmering layer of Bavarian cream sounds tempting, doesn't it? The gingerbread is made from a make-when-you-wish and bake-later refrigerator mix and it is baked in a spring form pan. **GINGERBREAD BAVARIAN:** Cream ½ cup butter, add ½ cup sugar slowly and beat well. Mix and sift together 1½ cups flour, ½ teaspoon soda, 2 teaspoons baking powder, ¼ teaspoon salt, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, 1 teaspoon ginger and ½ teaspoon nutmeg and thoroughly blend into the creamed mixture. Store in refrigerator. If yours is a modern, air-conditioned ice refrigerator you can store this mix satisfactorily for some time, for in such a refrigerator the clean-washed, properly-moist air is in constant circulation, keeping the mix sufficiently moist and sweet and free from foreign food odors. When ready to bake, remove mix from refrigerator and break up mixture with a pastry blender. Combine 1 beaten egg, ½ cup molasses and ½ cup sour milk and add to cake mixture. Beat thoroughly, then pour in greased spring-form pan. Bake in a moderate oven (350°) for approximately 35-40 minutes. Remove from pan to cool, then replace in pan. Top with your favorite orange Bavarian cream and chill in ice refrigerator until set.
