### AN INSTRUMENT OF DEATH

Every person who has fought his way through traffic tangles and missed death by inches in spine-chilling autumn highway encounters, has his own ideas concerning reduction of the horrible automobile accident toll.

Here's a simple formula which might help:

Whenever you take the wheel of your automobile, repeat to yourself the fact that you are manipulating an instrument of death; that the slightest miscalculation in your handling may mean a one-way ticket to eternity—for yourself or someone else.

Men have learned to display caution in the presence of fire, explosives, guns, super-sharp tools and high-speed machinery; an automobile is all of these things combined. At 80 miles an hour an automobile will play and mangle just as efficiently as any implement of war, even if on a smaller scale.

The automobile, as at present designed, is safe only when under the control of an experienced, competent, cautious driver. If you are not thus qualified, you should drive only at low speeds or in company of a good instructor. Otherwise you will be nothing but a willing tool of the never-resting Reaper.

Next time you step on the starter of your automobile, remind yourself that you are in command of an engine of destruction. Maybe that will temper your action at the next intersection, or a mile down the highway.

### WILD OR MILD

The returns now seem to be in, and it looks like a tie. About half of the Mid-Columbia's weather prophets are forecasting another long, hard winter, while the other half contends that time-tried and long-tested signs all indicate it is going to be both short and balmy.

As long as they are evenly divided, there is always the chance, of course, that half of them are bound to be right. But the average person isn't being fooled by their predictions. He is putting his house in order for whatever comes. If it is a mild season, he will be thankful. If it is a severe one, he is prepared to make the best of it. The only thing ahead that he looks forward to with dread is the coming of spring, when at least one-half of these amateur weather prophets will be chirping: "I told you so!"
