OREGON'S TOURISTS TRAVEL SHOWS INCREASE THIS YEAR

Oregon's automobile tourist travel increased 10 per cent this year over the previous record year of 1936, registration records show. More than 150,000 motor vehicles will have crossed state lines into Oregon when the final tallies are made for the year, predicts Earl Snell, secretary of state.

With 17,228 non-resident automobiles checked in September, the percentage of increase over the same month of the preceding year has continued. During the first nine months of this year 133,357 vehicles registered with the various stations throughout the state.
