Gibson First Buyer in Seal Sale

L. B. Gibson, superintendent of county schools, proved himself to be Hood River's first public spirited citizen when he was the first person in Hood River County to pay for his quota of Christmas seals. The first business concern to purchase seals was the Pacific Power & Light Company, and the first individual to mail his payment was Superintendent of City Schools J. L. Breckenridge.

"The penny Christmas seal this year depicts a jolly and colorful town crier," states Mr. Gibson. "Lantern in one hand and bell in the other he is ringing in the good news that tuberculosis is preventable and curable. Christmas seals fight tuberculosis—if you buy them."

Says Daniel J. Doherty, National Commander of the American Legion, "I consider it a great privilege to give my hearty endorsement of the heroic fight the National Tuberculosis Association is waging against the white plague. We have made prevention of tuberculosis one of the most important activities in the American Legion's child welfare program. I urge one and all to buy according to the measure of their means the annual Christmas seals. I commend this as an act of high public service."

65 Year old Workers May Claim Payments

"Some wage earners who have reached the age of 65 this year and are entitled to a lump-sum of three and one-half per cent of wages earned since the first of this year have failed to file claims for these benefits under the mistaken belief that they must quit work before they can get the money," advises James E. Peebles, manager of the Portland field office, Bureau of Old-Age Insurance, Social Security Board.

"There is no requirement in the Social Security Act that wage earners must quit working before they claim lump-sum payments. Inquiries we receive at our office in the Old Post Office Building indicate that a good many workers are making this mistake," Peebles explained.

"In case of death a wage earner's estate is given also a lump-sum settlement. The lump-sum payments at 65, and to the worker's estate at death, are figured on the basis of \$35 for each \$1000 wages earned since January 1, 1937, on employment covered by the Social Security Act," Peebles added.
